Jack Lemon was an American actor and musician and an eight time Academy Award nominee, who starred in over 60 films, including *Some Like It Hot, The Apartment, Days of Wine and Roses, The Great Race, The China Syndrome*. He was born on February 8, 1925 in an elevator at Newton-Wellesley Hospital in Newton, Massachusetts, a suburb of Boston. He was the only child of Mildred Burgess LaRue (née Noel) and John Uhler Lemmon, Jr., the president of a doughnut company. He died of cancer at the age of 76 on June 27 2001.
