Joint Birthing Kit Project – Message from Julie Carman

As many of you know, our Rotary Club has been planning a Joint Birthing Kit Project with the women's service club, **Zonta Club of Adelaide Torrens**. Both our clubs have committed **\$1500** for the purchase of all items to be packaged in the 1000 birthing kits which will be **assembled by 60 women on the afternoon of 18th July**. The kits will be taken to a developing country by the Birthing Kit Association. The availability of these simple kits has been shown to reduce mother and baby deaths. All details of the birthing kit assembly day are on the attached flyer.

The Rotary Club of Magill Sunrise now needs to find **30 women who can be available to join with 30 Zonta members in assembling the birthing kits**. There is usually considerable interest in these worthwhile and fun afternoons, so please let me know ASAP if yourself/any friends can join us. We are limited to 30 participants.

We are fortunate to have **Jenny Weaver** from the **Birthing Kit Foundation** as **guest speaker at our 7th July club meeting**. Members/Friends of our club who bring a friend(s) with them on the birthing kit assembly day might like to invite their friend to this Tuesday morning club meeting, as this would help them to get some background information about the excellent work which this organisation does in developing countries.

A man of profound religious convictions, Penn wrote numerous works in which he exhorted believers to adhere to the spirit of Primitive Christianity. He was imprisoned several times in the Tower of London due to his faith, and his book *No Cross, No Crown* (1669), which he wrote while in prison, has become a Christian classic.
