- The smaller group discussing strategic planning for the club reiterated the need for continuity in the

EDITOR'S COMMENT: OUR INVOCATION

There has been robust discussion over the years as to whether we should retain the traditional invocation, with its theme of gratitude and giving thanks. The affirmation of 'Amen' seems to stick in the craw of some. I recently came across an explanation for the link between happiness/wellness and gratitude (see quote below). So rather than doing away with a tradition that may have health benefits for us maybe we can come up with an alternative that appears less like a prayer.

"Psychologists studying the effects of positive emotions say gratitude can boost our sense of happiness if we turn it into a conscious and regular practice. Feeling gratitude, they say, is something you do (such as expressing gratitude or keeping a gratitude journal), not something you wait for!"


