He is married with two children, and loves umpiring cricket and footy. Overall you get a sense David is really happy.



ASD affects 1 in 100 people in Australia and is more prevalent in males than females (4:1). The main areas of development which are affected are social communication, restricted interests and behaviours and sensory processing. No two people on the spectrum are the same, so each individual requires specific support tailored for them.

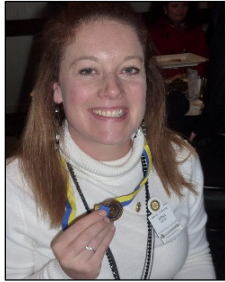
FUTURE DATES FOR THE DIARY
