Sue emphasised that palliative care is for the living not just for the dying, and should be seen as enhancing quality of life whilst living with life a threatening condition. There are many facets to this support e.g. emotional, dietary, exercise, beauty care. Together they ensure whole person care of a person on their journey of life, however close they are to death. Sue is happy to discuss with anyone about this topic and *Advanced Care Directives*, which are another important thing everybody should be considering.
