On Tuesday morning we welcomed to our meeting **Brett Howard**, President of **Polio SA**. Many younger Australians are unaware of the Polio Epidemic that swept Australia in the 1940s and early 50s. Those that recovered, with varying levels of disability, are now suffering '*late stage effects*'. **Polio SA** was set up to support the '*late staggers*'. Brett demonstrated his own aid, a plastic foot support, that stops him tripping over.

Club members from that era recalled their painful inoculations of the **Salk Vaccine**, which were injected to stop the disease. Until 1955, when the Salk vaccine was introduced, [polio](#) was considered one of the most frightening public health problems in the world. *"Apart from the atomic bomb, America's greatest fear was polio."*
