

DG Bob Cooper spoke to us about some of the key issues within Rotary this year. RI President **Ian Risely's** theme for the year is **Making a Difference**. The **End Polio** program is very close to achieving its goal of eradicating polio from the planet, and Rotary is urging everyone to continue their support the Foundation in this endeavour. Our **District's Polio Ute Relay** will kick off soon, to advertise the work of Rotary and raise funds for the Polio program. Our Club is being asked to support the project when the Ute comes into our area.

Membership is an important issue to all Clubs. Bob went on to highlight the 'Dare To Be Different' Regional Membership Conference being held in Flinders University over the weekend of 26/27th August. This event includes a keynote speech from the renowned entrepreneur Mitty Chang. Bob has suggested that at least two members attend the conference. WEEKLY CHALLENGE

Check out the **District 9520 (Clubrunner)** website (http://rotary9520.org/). It is packed full of information about Rotary and our District activities. Importantly, I ask that you **activate your account** (to receive a username and password), by clicking on the "Members Login" text up in the TOP RIGHT part of the page. You will then be taken to the blue and grey Clubrunner login page. For those who do not already have an account, click on the text at the bottom of the box in the centre of the screen "New and existing users: retrieve login and/or reset password". On the next page, select your Club from the pull-down list and enter your last name and the email address that you already receive emails from Rotary.

Note: if you do not receive an email reply with login details then check your 'junk mail'.

SHELTER BOX: SENT TO TURKISH/SYRIAN BORDER

Several years ago, we donated funds for a Shelterbox. The original plan was to support the **Fiji Cyclone** situation. Our box was not immediately required, but put into reserve; a bit like a sausage factory. Without our gift going in one end Shelterbox cannot push another out the other to send to Fiji.
