ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The encouraging news from our brief AGM, was hearing that the **Club is still solvent**. Our accounts grew a little over the last financial year – helped in no small part by bonus from the income from the **Adelaide Festival Car Parking** gig. I guess, putting up with dust and flies, followed by freezing nights was worth it. Our quorum accepted the Financial Report. We did not have any nominees for future Board positions, but that will be an action on the current Board to seek nominations asap.

MEETING FREQUENCIES

Six months ago, the Club agreed **to trial meeting twice a month**. Now is the time to review how this experiment worked. We discussed the good and bad of the last six months. Broadly, many people enjoyed not having to get out of bed early every week. On the flip side, if your busy lifestyle means you miss a meeting, then you may be a month before you see your fellow Rotarians. This impacts on connectedness to the Club and possibly dampens enthusiasm for what we are doing. In addition, our 1st and 3rd week plan gets put into chaos when we have a Monday holiday preceding the meeting date and defer to somewhere else in the month.

Lindsay raised an interesting middle option: Plan for a meeting on the 1st, 2nd and 3rd weeks of the month. If one week is impacted by a holiday Monday, we can cancel the Tuesday meeting and still remain within our Constitutional minimum of two meetings per month. The 4th week can be an opportunity for a fellowship event in the evening.

Rather than rush into a decision, we will put an email (maybe a private Facebook message stream too) to members stating the three options, their good and bad points, and initiate a discussion. We will aim to hold a vote at our **first meeting (16th January)** to resolve where we go from here – possibly another six month trial.


Extract from Xmas Message from Peter Poulton: Norwood Rotary
