WELCOME: GUEST SPEAKER, ANNA DODD SYC

This week we had **Anna Dodd from SYC** (Service to Youth Council) give us a presentation to a small but enthusiastic group of members. Anna is a Partnership Advisor at SYC and she took us through the arm of the business **she thinks we would be a good fit in supporting, that being HYPA** (Helping Young People Achieve) (don't you love acronyms), the youth services division of SYC.

One of the main areas that the crisis team at HYPA deal with is Youth Homelessness and HYPA have a program in place where they provide a **safe environment for young people aged between 15 and 25** for support. Like the Hutt Street Centre for adults they provide things like warm clothes, food, toiletries etc. to any youth that requires these items due to homelessness. This program exists with **no government or corporate funding** and relies solely on donations to continue to operate.

Another initiative HYPA offer is HYPA Housing, safe and affordable mid-term housing for people aged between 17 and 25 who are experiencing homelessness. **SYC have 36 apartments located across 3 metropolitan locations that offer:**

- 18-24 month leases where young people pay a maximum 30% of their income on rent
- An onsite Youth Worker to provide individual support and help tenants develop skills such as cooking and budgeting
- That tenants are required to engage with learning and/or working during their stay
- That when they leave HYPA housing they have acquired skills, confidence and a pathway to employment for long term independence

I have spoken to Anna about our club helping these young people move into these apartments by way of transporting and assembling furniture and just being there to support them with the move. There are also other ways we could help such as donating crisis supplies, volunteering at an event or volunteering in a group program (teaching basics like cooking and budgeting). So have a thought on how you think we could help and get back to me...(Tash already had a thought of us putting together some basic toiletry packs for homeless youths – tooth brush and tooth paste, shower gel etc.)
