Long-time servant of Rotary International and member of the Rotary Club of Campbelltown has passed away after a short illness.

Eric, 87, was the chairman of **Spring Gully Foods** for a remarkable 52 years before standing down last year although he still retained his seat on the board.

He was the stepson of company founder Ted McKee and the **father** of current managing director, **Kevin Webb** (foundation President of our own club). **Megan**, granddaughter and former club member of Magill Sunrise is seen with Eric in the photo below. When Mr Webb joined Spring Gully in 1964 it was still operating from basic facilities near Rostrevor. But in 1993 Mr Webb oversaw the move to a modern factory at Dry Creek, which enabled Spring Gully Foods to expand and become a national supplier of condiments and pickles. **Spring Gully Foods has and is a benevolent patron** for our and other Clubs and Charities, as evidenced by stocking the fund raising stall for the **Cougars Netball Club at our own Mega Xmas Market** last weekend. We win, the Cougars win, the Community wins and hopefully so does Spring Gully.

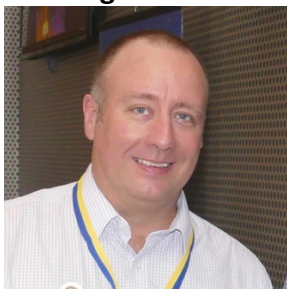
