### JAYNE SHORT: VINNIES

You may recall that we donated \$1500 to them towards Vinnies Bushfire Appeal. In response Jayne Short from St Vincent de Paul paid visit us on Tuesday to tell us a little more on what they do. Now I could bore you with my notes but I think the facts she gave us are more impressive:

#### Some of the programs they run:

- **Bushfire Relief Program:**
    - Just over \$1.5 million raised in SA
    - This figure doesn't include the huge volumes of food, water, clothing, toiletries, bedding, and other essentials that Vinnies members have been providing in their communities
    - 100 per cent of donations to the Vinnies Bushfire Appeal go to those affected on the ground
  - **Assistance Program to support to those experiencing poverty, helping with:**
    - Food
    - Clothing
    - assistance with paying bills or medicines if they are sick
    - 824 conference members (volunteers)
    - 51,405 people assisted
    - 20,821 home visits
    - \$2.34 million in assistance provided
  - **Fred's Van, feeding the homeless and hungry in SA**
    - 10 locations
    - 42,081 meals served in 2019
    - 653 volunteers
  - **Other**
    - Drought Relief
    - Migrant and Refugee Centre
    - Women's Crisis Centre
    - Men's Crisis Centre

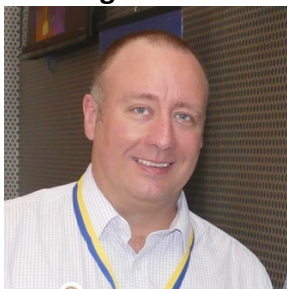
