MARK THOMPSON: WWI & WWII

Club Member, **Mark Thompson**, Vietnam Veteran and Bulletin Editor was our speaker at last Tuesday's Meeting. Mark's topic was scheduled for February to mark the anniversary of the **bombing of Darwin** in 1942 and was to include other Australian towns/ports that were attacked in WWII.

For various reasons Mark presentation was bumped to St Patrick's Day, so he put to good use his viewing of the History Channel on Fox and came up with some interesting facts and statistics from World Wars One and Two. Mark finished with his **weirdest Fact** in WWII:

'In WWII soviet citizens could directly finance their own tank or aeroplane. This led to married couple Ivan Boyko and Alexandra Samusenko **purchasing their own heavy tank**. Not satisfied with this, they applied for training and ended up in combat in their own tank in 1944 until the end of the war. Alexandra became the tank commander and Ivan the driver. She was the only female tank commander in WII. Both were severely wounded, and both survived till old age, but not together, as the split in the 1950s. I guess without the rush of battle the sex was never the same'
