VIRTUAL QUIZ NIGHT

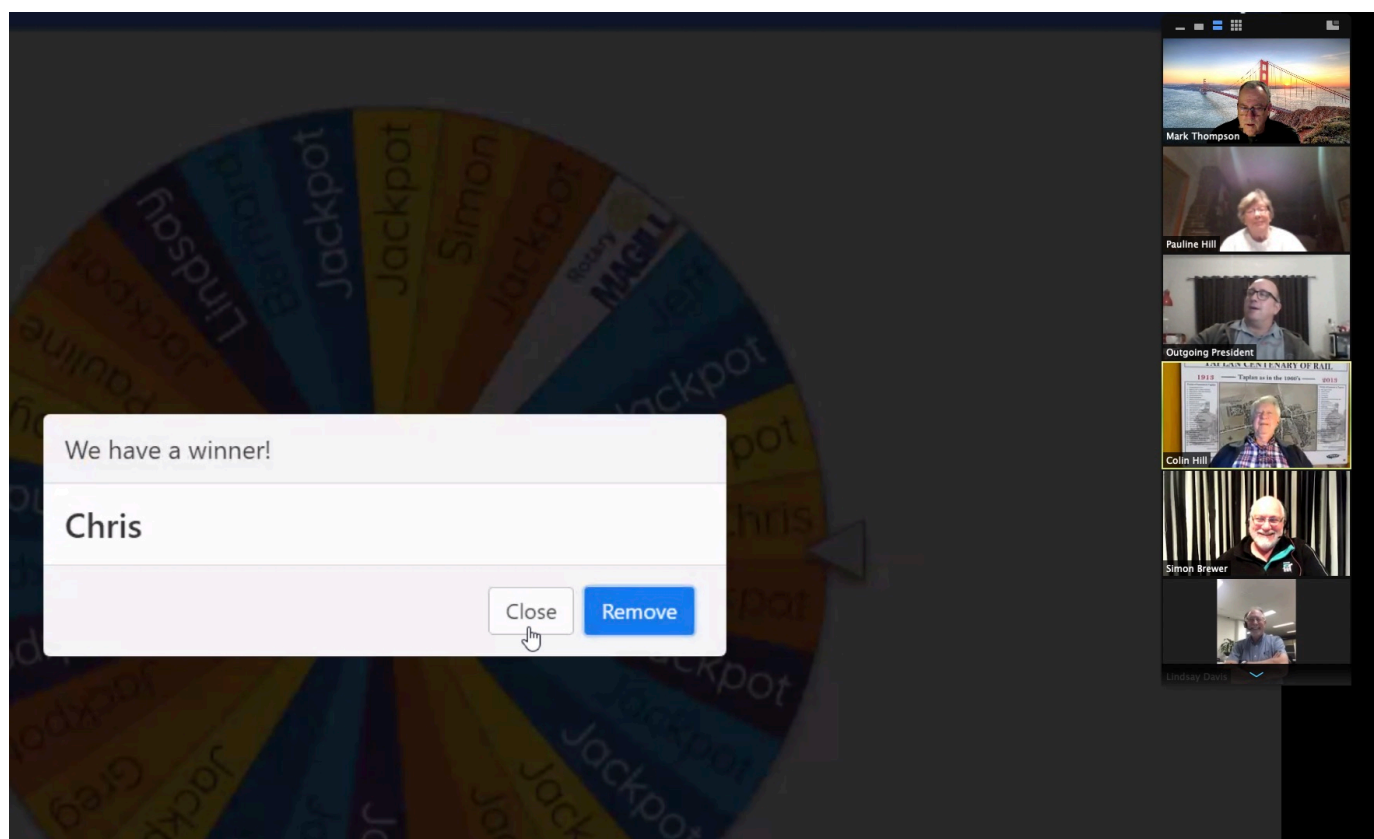

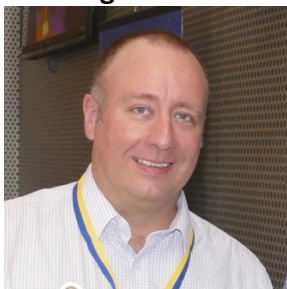
