# WHAT'S YOUR FAVOURITE MEAT DISH:




- President of the Australian Croatian Chamber of Commerce S.A. Inc

David tells us that **Croatia is around 80% the size of Tasmania** with a population of 4 million, with an economy of double that of Tasmania. This means that it is a relatively poor country where the average income is about \$1000 per month. The town of Petrinja has a population of 20,000 (similar to Mt. Gambier). So, imagine every house in Mt. Gambier made unliveable. David's business interests in Croatia meant that he could provide temporary housing, but this can't last forever. **David urged us to use Rotary's own Croatian earthquake relief as a means of donating**. The board will make a decision on the amount at our next meeting.
