

SIMON'S QUIZ QUESTION

How did the Riverland town of Glossop acquire its name?

The town of Glossop was named after Vice Admiral John Collings Taswell Glossop

Glossop, and Englishman was given a command in the fledgling Royal Australian Navy's new light cruiser, HMAS *Sydney*, in June 1913; he had held the RAN rank of Captain since March. *Sydney* sailed for Australia in company with the new flagship, the battlecruiser HMAS *Australia*, and received a tumultuous welcome on arrival in Sydney in October.

On 9 November 1914 Sydney was part of a convoy was some fifty miles (80km) off the Cocos Islands when the wireless station there reported the **presence of a German cruiser**. Sydney was detached to investigate. The raider, the light cruiser **SMS** *Emden*, stood out to sea and engaged *Sydney* at extreme range, killing four sailors and destroying the range-finder before *Sydney* opened fire. However, *Sydney*, with the advantage in speed and armament, thereafter, stayed out of *Emden*'s range, reducing her to a blazing shambles.

Emden had cut a swathe of destruction through British and allied shipping in the Indian Ocean and the news of her end was received with jubilation and Glossop was held in high esteem in Australia



Former Prime Minister Paul Keating has always held the view that WWI was a European conflict in which Australia should have never become involved. That may be so, but if Germany had won WWI (and it nearly did) then it may have held hegemony over Australia and New Zealand. Remember, Australia was only handed German New Guinea after WWI. Instead of Democracy we'd possibly have a German Monarchy, but the trade-off would be driving a Mercedes instead of a Morris.
