CHAPEL STREET COMMUNITY GARDEN: FRANK BANKS

The Community Garden was officially opened in 2012, and club's introduction to the Garden was in 2014, Colin Hill's year of presidency when we joined with Burnside Rotary Club in donating to the construction of a gazebo. Colin got to smash a bottle of champagne over the Gazebo along with Burnside's president. The land was donated to the Burnside Council over 100 years ago and the Garden now has 45 members for the 35 plots available. Many members had no previous experience in growing vegetables, so in early days it was 'the blind leading the blind'. In 2011 Burnside Council kick started the project with \$80K and Frank estimates that Council has donated somewhere between \$200K and \$300K to the Garden. Future plans are making the most of available space and increasing the number of plots along with efficient watering technology. We wish Frank and the members of the Chapel Street Community Garden all the best in their future endeavours. No photos of the Garden as they are too difficult to lift from social media.
