WHAT'S YOUR MOST MEMORABLE BIRTHDAY?

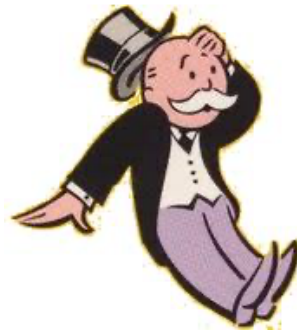
