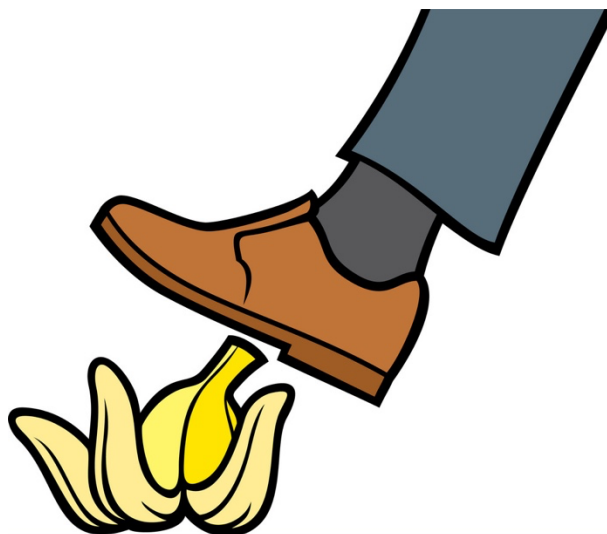
FIVE GOOD FRIENDS: SAM CARSON
