REPLAS (RECYCLED PLASTICS)

At Tuesday's meeting we welcomed **Robbie Westley** from *Replas*, who came to speak about the work his company does in recycling used plastic and turning it into a wide range of products within the community.

They obtain plastic from a multitude of sources, including plastic bags, bumper bars, hospital shrinkwrap and more, and then transforms into plastic bollards, outdoor benches, pathways, decking and more. Robbie is obviously passionate about what he does, and *Replas* contributes a huge amount to the Australian environment, by redirecting used plastic from ending up in waste. <u>Just one *Replas* bollard prevents over</u> <u>2500 plastic bags ending up in landfill!</u> Amazing work.
