VALE MINA WARD

During the week we learned of the **sudden passing** of **former Club President Mina Ward**. Her death resulted from an accidental choking incident last Sunday in Darwin. Mina is remembered for her great compassion for those less well off, and in addition to her efforts here she also raised money for the homeless in her home town of Gloucester, UK.

Although 'Aussiefied', Mina was a strong supporter of the **English Lions Ruby Team** and was their **team physio** when touring Australia.

Mina loved a challenge, so why not **Swim the English Channel**. 'Team Fidget' (with sister Bridget) was ready to go, but the sisters could not find that break in the fickle weather in their allocated window. Undeterred they took on the **Scilly Islands** Long Distance Swim. Sponsorship from this swim helped **build a toilet and shower block** for the homeless in Gloucester.

Mina first joined Rotary at **Naracoorte**, and then **our club** when she lived in Adelaide from 2011 – 2016. Mina's work took her to the remote North West town of **Karratha** before moving to **Darwin/Tiwi Islands** in January of this year. She had just joined the **Rotary Club of Darwin** prior to her passing.

BEHIND THE BADGE: SIMON BREWER

New Club Member, **Simon Brewer** was our speaker at Tuesday Morning's Breakfast. We thought we were in for a prolonged address from Simon when he pulled out the contents a mobile library from his dilly bag. As it turned out each book was linked to something important in his life or was a link to the Family Tree. The first Brewer migrated from Cornwall, while German ancestors first anchored at Holdfast Bay on Captain Hahn's Zebra, 28th December 1838. As a boy, **another ancestor travelled with** Richard Schomburgk, designer of the **Adelaide Botanic Gardens**, on an expedition to British Guyana to bring back the Garden's **famous waterlily.** Other branches of the family fought against each other in the **Battle of Waterloo**, in 1815. The Editor went for a Bex and a Lie Down when Simon explained the various religious branches of the family; referring at one point to **The Failure of the Anglican-Prussian Ecumenical Effort of 1710-1714.** Simon's family (including 4 brothers) moved to Rostrevor when Simon was aged 4. Simon's work history began on the **assembly floor of Kelvinators**, Woodville North in 1983, **and by 2000 had risen to senior staff (IT).** Some of the systems written by the IT team are **still used by Electrolux's Asian Branch.** Simon now works in IT Aged Care. Another interesting anecdote was how he became the **'Reluctant Mayor'** of the City of Campbelltown. Simon is seen holding a book on the **History of his much-loved Holden Car**, being the proud owner of the first model, FX.


