- **Working:** Helping people to gain and sustain work in all its forms
- **Home:** Working with people to have a stable home, a sense of home and to feel safe and secure in their home
- **Justice:** Supporting people to build pro-social connections and make positive choices

SYC sound like an amazing organisation which happens to have the **CEO of Campbelltown Council Paul Di Iulio on their board**, so I will have to try to get him out one morning to tell us more about them.

Our quick assembly on membership might have only been a quick one but it was very insightful for me and has helped me get some ideas where we can focus our attention. It will require a lot more work and also the club as a whole to push our membership forward but is something I am confident we can achieve.
