- The Plug In Connects older people with business, industry and researchers.
- **Zest Fest** An annual festival designed to celebrate, challenge and connect older South Australians. The festival features more than 200 curated and fringe events across the state during October.
- **Strength for Life** Promotes health and well-being for people over 50 through personalised strength training programs.
- **Community Visitors Scheme** Provides friendly volunteers to visit older people who are at risk of loneliness or social isolation.

These are just a few of all the amazing programs they run, and **predominantly by a volunteer force of 140**. It was a topic that had quite a bit of interest from our 'young' club members who had questions for Carol during and upon completion of her presentation. **Thank you for coming to see us Carol**, an interesting topic regarding a demographic that is only getting bigger.

1493 – Explorer Christopher Columbus lands on Puerto Rico for the first time.

1863 – US President Abraham Lincoln delivers his Gettysburg address beginning; "Four score and seven years ago..."

1703 – The legendary 'Man in the Iron Mask' dies.

1916 – Samuel Goldwyn and Edgar Selwyn establish Goldwyn Pictures, the company later became one of the most successful independent filmmakers. The famous quote, 'A verbal contract is not worth the paper it's written on' is a misappropriation for Goldwyn. He actually said that a friend's verbal contract was better than written. Goldwyn introduced Leo the Lion as a trademark for his pictures, but had no controlling interest in what later became Metro Goldwyn Mayer (MGM)

1946 – Australian country music singer Slim Dusty records his first single, 'When the Rain Tumbles Down' **1997** – The world's first septuplets to all survive are born.
