### **MARK THOMPSON: TRIP TO JAPAN**

Almost another full house this week plus a surprise visit from coordinator of the YAK (Youth Advisory Committee for City of Campbelltown.

This week our speaker was club member Mark Thompson, who entertained us with his experiences on his recent trip to Japan. Peter and Emiko Mayer from RC Morialta), who were unofficial team leaders for Mark and Mari Thompson, Bob and Marylyn Cooper (Burnside) and Di Potter, former Rotarian. RC Morialta and the Japanese Club of Usa (on the island of Kyushu) have a formal relationship, where they host Rotarians from each club on an alternating biennial basis. Members of the Usa club will visit Morialta in 2021.

The visit to **Usa** was the culmination of the 2 week trip, with the journey beginning in Toyko and in the main heading in south westerly direction to the island of Kyushu. An exception to travelling west was a day trip to the city of **Mito**, 100 km north east of Tokyo, where the group was welcomed by Rotarians and taken for a tour of the famous gardens before a cultural exchange at a **UNESCO sponsored high school** of Chigaku-kan. In addition to exposure to **traditional Japanese** songs, music, dance and martial arts, the **Thompsons** and **Coopers** got to play dress up in kimonos.

Most of the travel in Japan was done by **train** (high speed or suburban/subway. Travelling at just under 300 km/h meant it was quick and easy to get from one city to the next. It paid not to tarry on the train at your destination because the commuter had 90 seconds to exit before the doors shut. Train staff would bow to the passengers in each carriage as they moved from one carriage to another; a very polite race.

The group visited the ancient capital of **Kyoto**, the cultural centre of Japan, where many ancient structures were left undamaged from bombing in WWII. Further west they visited Fukuyama and Hiroshima. Just out of Hiroshima they had a guided tour of the **Mazda Factory and Museum**, which was quite an eye opener.

The group was spoiled rotten with hospitality when they finally arrived at **Usa** on the beautiful island of Kyushu. Usa is famous for its shrine, which was the first in Japan where **Buddhism blended with Shinto**. This blending of religions then spread through the rest of Japan. The group crammed so much into the time on Kyushu that this bulletin could not accommodate all of the activities, suffice to say that **Mark and Mari will never forget the hospitality of the member of the RC of Usa**. A special thanks to the President of the

Usa Club, **Norihiko Sumimoto**, and devoted tour guides **Katsuhoshi Kawabata**, **Tetsuya Yonezawa** and **Nobuku Honsho**, who gave up much of their time to the touring group.






## KINGSTON HOUSE: SOCIAL FUNCTION
