Our primary speaker was **Robin Holmes**, by day a Chartered Accountant but by night and on the weekends for the last **43 years he has kept busy as a volunteer CFS firefighter** with the Burnside team. He eloquently told us more about the Cudlee Creek and Kangaroo Island bushfires. Suffice to say by the time he was finished I think we were all a little more in awe of what **these amazing volunteers** did for the community over the holiday period and how much they sacrificed to help others in need. I think facts and photos are the best way to get across the enormity of the task that confronted them:

- Hundreds of appliances over these fires (with maybe more than 30 additional appliances sent to KI)
- Thousands of firefighting days with
- multiple 12 hour shifts on Cudlee Creek
- Multiple 5 day shifts on KI (day crews and night crews)
- Nearly a thousand aerial drops (AT 802, Helitak702, LAT)
- Over 4000 photos, plans, maps and incident logs on the KI complex fire
- Many volunteers did four shifts on KI in the Incident Management Team

The fact that the mobile weather station at the Flinders Chase Rangers Station shut down when the temperature hit 400C give you an idea of the danger faced by these brave volunteers. Simply an extraordinary effort by what we might think of as ordinary human beings, thank you Robin and thank you to all CFS volunteers out there.
