
'ZOOM' MEETING #3: ABLE AUSTRALIA


We had another great turnout at Tuesday's meeting with all but one member in attendance. We also had our guests from **Able Australia (Alisha and Carla**), our guests from **Sign Language Australia (Emma and Heather)** and some outsiders in **David and Sabrina Koister** from RC Morialta and past member **Licaria Scheepers.** It was awesome to see such a large Zoom meeting screen in action and was the first time we have had to mute all but the talkers due to the larger attendance.


Our **guest speakers this week were from Able Australia**, an organization we have recently joined with to support some individuals go to a **DeafBlind camp** in the not too distant future (hopefully). So, this was the topic of their presentation and wasn't it amazing to see them present with the help of technology. We had **Carla** up first who signed her part of the presentation and was supported by **Emma and Heather** from Sign Language Australia who interpreted her signing so we could understand what she was saying. Carla described how the camp run by **Able Australia has been operational for around 20 years** and started for people predominantly afflicted with Ushers Syndrome where they see the world through pin pricks. It has grown since and today the camp **helps support those in the DeafBlind community** by allowing them to meet and learn from others who share similar struggles, and to learn new skills, whilst having fun and making lasting bonds. This camp helps those who are DeafBlind come to terms with their disability and enables them to interact with those similarly affected.

Alisha was up next, and she walked us through the **typical activities** that they get up to on the camps, in particular a recent one that was held just before restrictions were brought in at **Phillip Island**. She described how Phillip Island was perfect for Able Australia's camps due to its size and accessibility for DeafBlind people. This camp had people from all over Australia attended with 38 DeafBlind individuals and 2 volunteer support staff for each person. It is amazing to hear what sorts of activities they do and from this you can understand how it would be so beneficial to the DeafBlind individuals' growth and confidence...activities like canoeing, craft workshops, archery and swimming, not to mention the Saturday night dress up Disco. From the slideshow and the way Alisha described the camp it looked and sounded like everyone had an absolute blast!!

Thank you for joining or Zoom meeting Carla, Alisha, Emma and Heather, it was awesome to see you guys work together to give us that presentation and thank you to David, Sabrina and Licaria for joining us also.
