We had another near full house of heads this week at our Tuesday Zoom meeting plus a **few special guests in Sue Lloyd from Athelstone Kiwanis and recent Sunrise Market stallholder** and our very own movie producer extraordinaire and **Magill Sunrise Past President Kirst Stark**. Kirsty was our guest speaker, giving us an insight into the making of her recently successful series that was on the **ABC "Stateless"** along with a **Q & A session**.

For those that don't know, the series **"Stateless"** is **partly inspired by the real-life story of Cornelia Rau**, an Australian permanent resident who was unlawfully detained under the Australian Government's mandatory detention program. It centres on four strangers in an immigration detention centre in the Australian desert: an airline hostess escaping a suburban cult, an Afghan refugee fleeing persecution, a young Australian father escaping a dead-end job and a bureaucrat caught up in a national scandal. When their lives intersect, they are pushed to the brink of sanity, yet unlikely and profound emotional connections are made amongst the group.

Some interesting facts we learnt from Kirsty in the Q & A regarding the shoot:

- The rehabilitation centre used for filming was built specifically for the series and was modelled on the Baxter Detention Centre
- It was built next to the real thing
- The series started as a idea brought forward by Kate Blanchett
- The series was recently sold to Netflix and will be screened in over 100 countries and in over 30 languages

A fantastic series and experience, thank you Kirsty for coming back to see us and give us the scoop on the whole thing. We all hope to see you again in the flesh at one of our meetings sometime soon!!

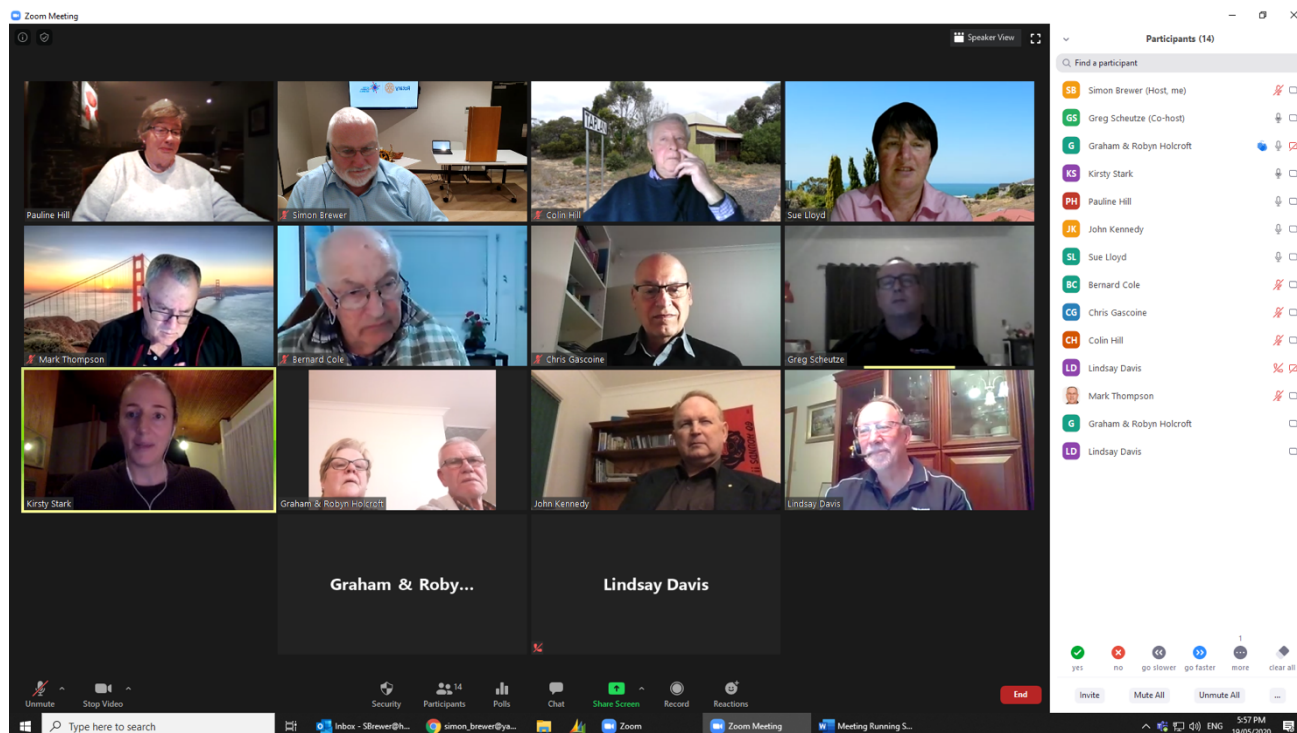

THE REPAIR CAFÉ

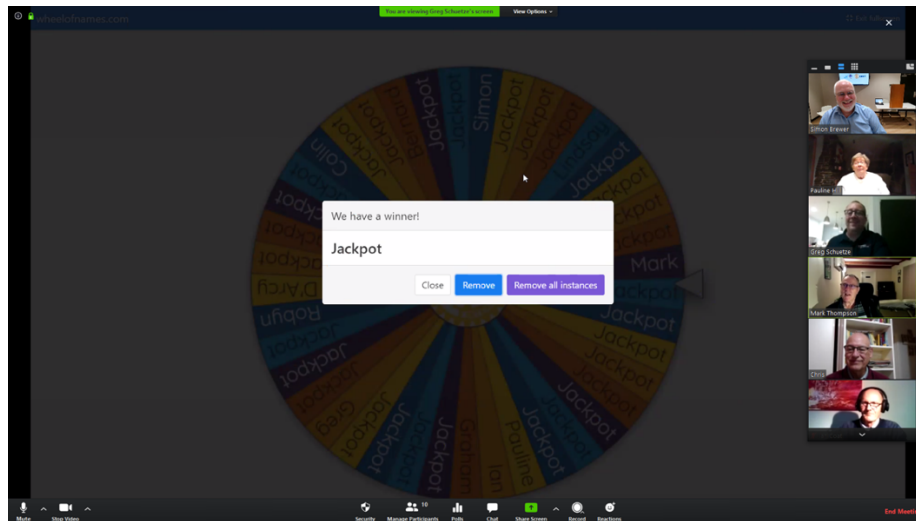
Sue Lloyd made mention of the Repair Café:

1948 – Australia's Federal Government announces that rail gauges across Australia will be standardized

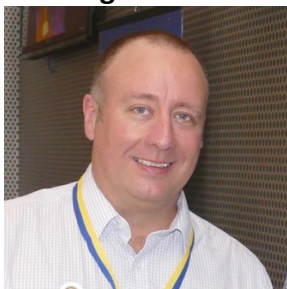
