Simon's research into the nearby club of Sisak, which will be running distribution is:

The Sisak Rotary Club seems like they have about 20-25 members, so they're not huge. From what I can gather they have identified **water testing and purification systems as a niche needs that they are working closely on**. It would also seem that 50 of the Croatian Rotary Clubs have sent people to help. Additionally, the Sisak club are sponsoring 250 high school students from the affected areas with scholarships (apparently 8 high schools were significantly damaged in the area affecting 2,000 students. Many are reported to have lost their homes).

PREVIEW OF HECTOVILLE SPORTING AND COMMUNITY CLUB


