Brigadier General Alexander Gore Arkwright Hore-Ruthven, 1st Earl of Gowrie, VC, GCMG, CB, DSO & Bar, PC ([/'hɔːr 'rɪvən/](#); 6 July 1872 – 2 May 1955) was a British Army officer who served as the 10th Governor-General of Australia, in office from 1936 to 1945. He was previously Governor of South Australia (1928–1934) and Governor of New South Wales (1935–1936)



Lady Gowrie Drive that runs from Largs Bay to Outer Harbour was named after his wife. Sadly, the First Earl of Gowrie was taken from us too soon, aged 82 in 1955.

YOUTH PARLIAMENT: ELLA GARROOD

Ella is a 15 year old, year 10 student at Seymour College and was sponsored by our club to participate in the **Youth Parliament Program**

YMCA South Australia Youth Parliament is a non-partisan program providing a platform for young people **aged 15 - 25** to have their say on important issues, build skills and parliamentary understanding. It focuses on personal development, empowerment and connecting politicians and decision makers with youth voices and opinions. The Youth Parliament program runs from **March to August** every year and includes **mentoring, a training weekend, a week-long camp** and access to Parliament House. Every year, young leaders come together to learn about public speaking, parliamentary etiquette, bill development and youth advocacy. **They share their big ideas, discuss the challenges facing South Australia and create solutions in the form of Youth Bills.**

Ella impressed us with her eloquent presentation of her experiences attending this program helped in part from the confidence gained in having to speak in front of her peers and argue her case. **Ella choice of Committee was Tourism/Arts/Culture** and her Bill was support artists/entertainers during the Covid restrictions by way of Government discounted and financial support. The Bill failed because they had bitten off more than they could chew with too many other issues linked to the Bill. A good lesson learned. All up Ella would have spent a month's effort on the Youth Parliament. **Well done Ella.**

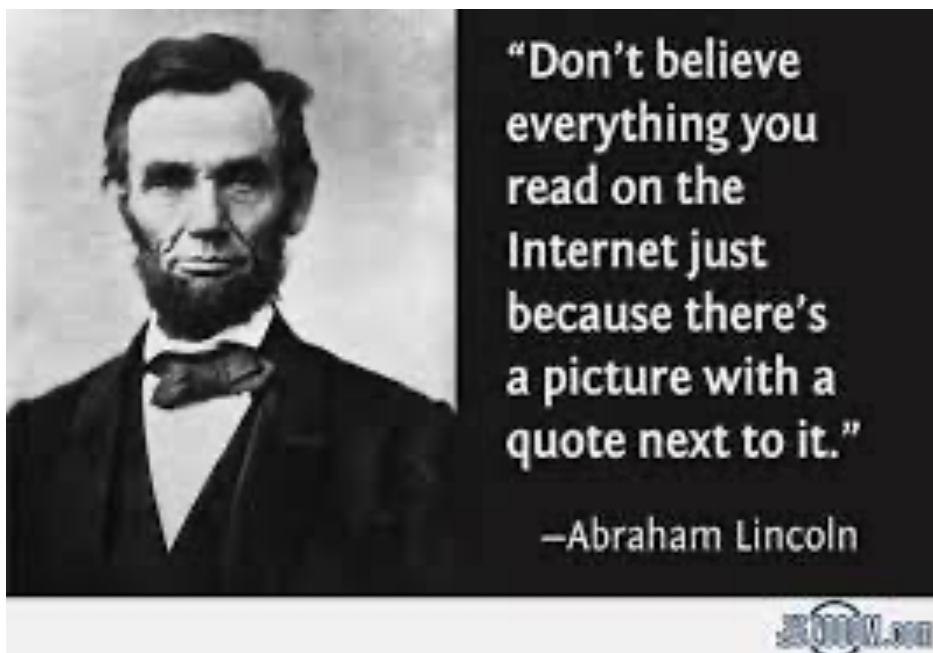
RYDA - Road Safety Youth Driver Awareness Program
