- Calperum is situated about 20km north of Renmark on Ral Ral Creek
- It was established in 1838 as a sheep and cattle station, but in 1993 was taken over by the Federal Government and the Chicago Zoo, who vested it with National Parks. They established a Biosphere Reserve Program, which is one of 14 in Australia listed with UNESCO.





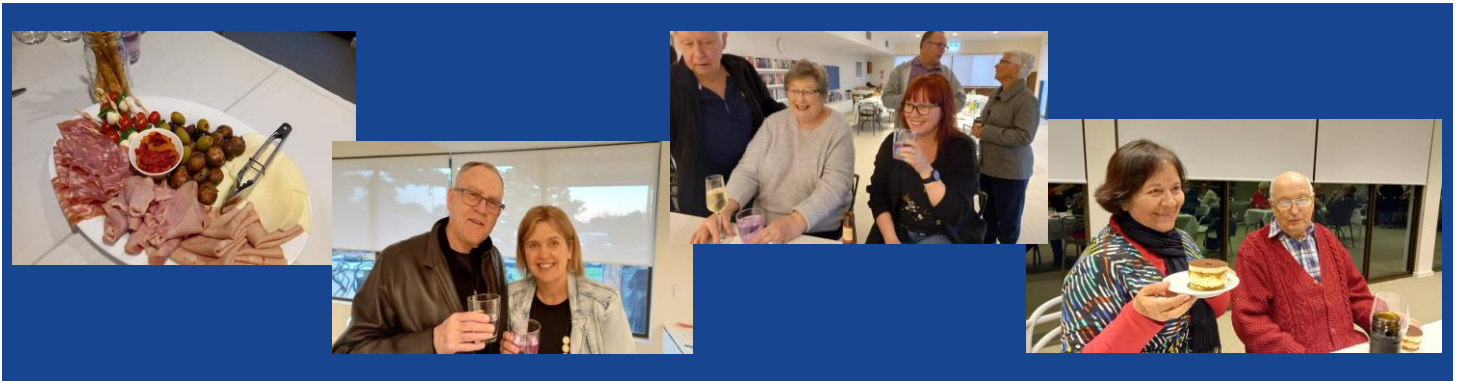
Social Event in Paradise

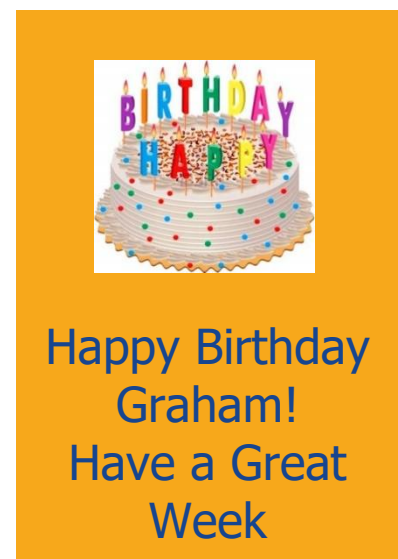

As no one took out the prize money this week we have a jackpot of \$20.00



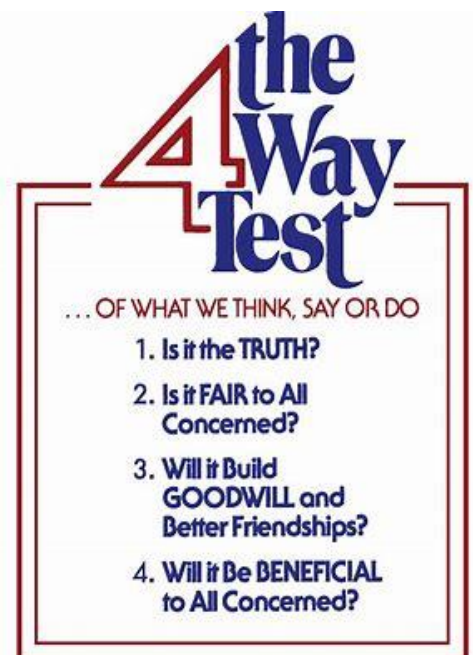
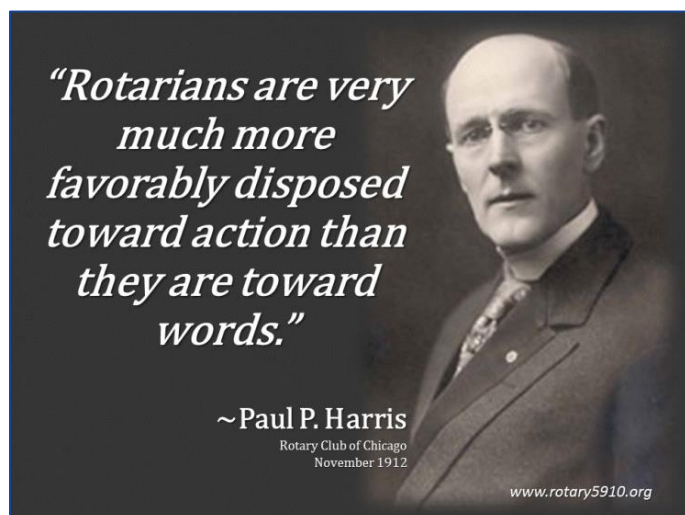
From the Board(ies)
