- A couple of possible shirt designs are in the newsletter for you to consider and provide feedback.
- **Rotary Learning Seminar** 27/28 November to be held at Charles Campbell College. Cost is \$90 per person and the club will pay. A great chance to improve your knowledge of Rotary and prepare for leadership roles.
- **Calperum Station** visit last weekend in October – need to get behind the great work started by Ian and Suzette in the name of our club. Ian has advised that despite local flooding the event will go ahead. Ian, Simon, Chris and Colin all likely starters at this stage with or without partners.

### **Club Assembly – Recruitment**

It was a superb discussion today exploring ways to encourage more membership. As we all know, many avenues have been tried, but we will need to continue trying for the club to survive. Some of the great ideas raised:

- Hold more joint meetings with other community groups and increase collaboration with them. Some already being worked on are Magill RSL and Hectorville Sports & Community Club. Suggestion to also include UniSA Magill in that list. More suggestions welcome.
- More discussion about UniSA Magill specifically with suggestions of a Rotaract or Satellite club. Recent communications with them around The Reel Event suggested involving Event Management students in club activities. Another suggestion was to look at the UniSA Plus Award system and see if we can get a foot in there (see <https://i.unisa.edu.au/students/experience-unisa/leadership-program/unisaplus/award-pillars/>). As an aside, we should be recording hours served by our member Don so he can be recognised by this program.
- Possible to establish a satellite club eg. Magill Sunset. All members of the satellite would be members of RCMS, but they may meet at a different time and place that suits them better. Would require a few RCMS members also to attend their meetings.



- 🌟 At the market hand out the club flyers rather than just have them sitting there. Maybe a free snag voucher in it to encourage people to open and read it? Maybe they need to answer a question about the club from the flyer for the freebie?
- 🌟 Send a letter of thanks to guest speakers and invite them to come along to our market.
- 🌟 Create short videos for use on Facebook, web site or market saying what we've recently been able to support through fundraising
- 🌟 Put up some signage at Hectorville Sports & Community Club where we meet
- 🌟 Target parents of RYLA and RYPEN students encouraging them to join the club
- 🌟 Leverage the Magill Village project by conducting a forum eg: Business Breakfast. Could use the Tower Hotel for example.
- 🌟 Keep recruitment regularly on the meeting agendas so we don't let these initiatives lapse and they are followed up
- 🌟 Set up some meeting dates where we letterbox local residents and invite them along for a free breakfast to learn about Rotary and encourage them to join (maybe do that in blocks eg. Magill Rd to Arthur St for one meeting, Arthur St to Montacute Rd for another). Another meeting could be a "bring a friend" meeting leveraging the RI President's "everyone bring one" suggested approach.
- 🌟 See if we can contact real estate agents to find out new residents and possibly letterbox or contact them to let them know of the Rotary opportunity in their local area

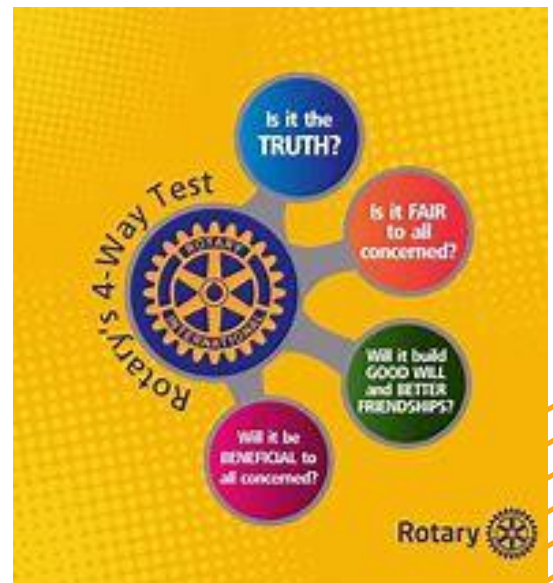
This week saw Greg reach the top of the hill.

## Club Shirts

As advised, we've had new club shirts on the agenda for some time and our public image is a very important part of assisting recruiting, so we need to get on with it. To do that we need to settle on a design that we all like and that really portrays who we are.

Here are a couple of options that use commonly available off-the-shelf shirt designs with our own embroidery for you to consider. We have gone for the classic navy/gold, but also a high visibility option that may work better than our vests at the market for example.

However, ideally what we want is club promotion. We want a shirt you would comfortably wear in public when not on Rotary duty to spread the word and the brand. 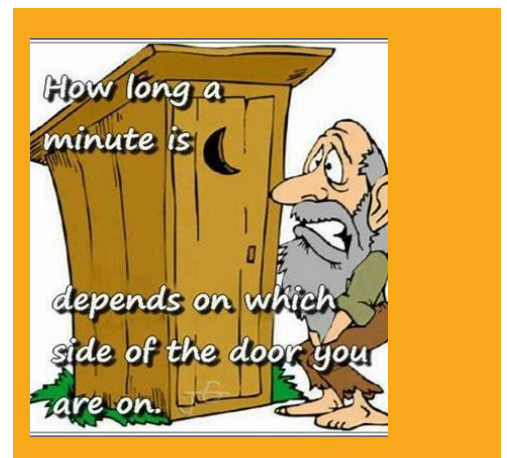

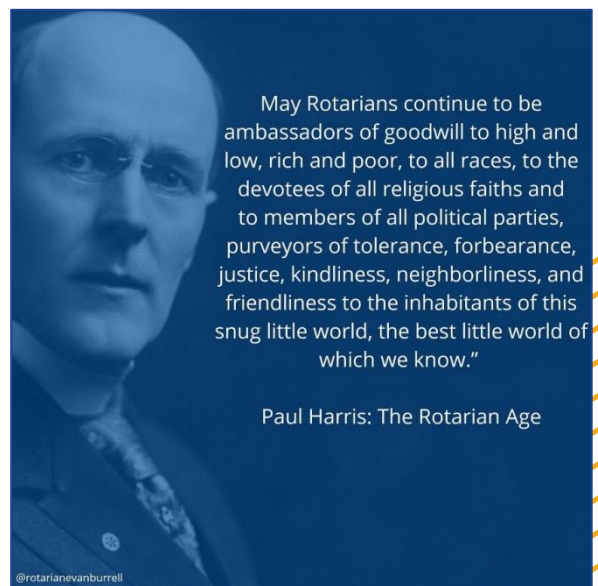
