Guest Speaker: Sebastian Cole – NMHS The Long Row

We welcomed Sebastian (Seb), his father Peter and his coach & teacher Ben. Seb then told us about his involvement in the school's rowing competition.

Norwood High School (as it was back then) introduced competitive rowing in 1982 for boys only, with girls joining the competition from 1988. When Norwood Morialta High School (NMHS) was formed in 1993 the sport has continued while having its ups and downs. Around 5 years ago there were 52 participants and now there are 90. It is anticipated when Year 7s are allowed to join this will climb to 120. NMHS usually buy their equipment second hand from the bigger schools that have traditionally dominated the sport.

In March this year NMHS achieved their highest ever position in rowing coming fourth at the annual "Head of the River" 2,000M race, which is like the grand final of school rowing. This was an extraordinary achievement and significantly better than any previous result and is down to the hard work of the rowing group from teachers/coaches through to participants. The winners of the SA competition this year went on to be the national champions, so NMHS are up there with the big guys.

It was a superb discussion today exploring ways to encourage more membership. As we all know, many avenues have been tried, but we will need to continue trying for the club to survive. Some of the great ideas raised:

Seb would like to go on to compete in the Olympics after school. This is his final year and he wants to give back to the school for allowing him to pursue his dream to date and inspire his team mates to take the



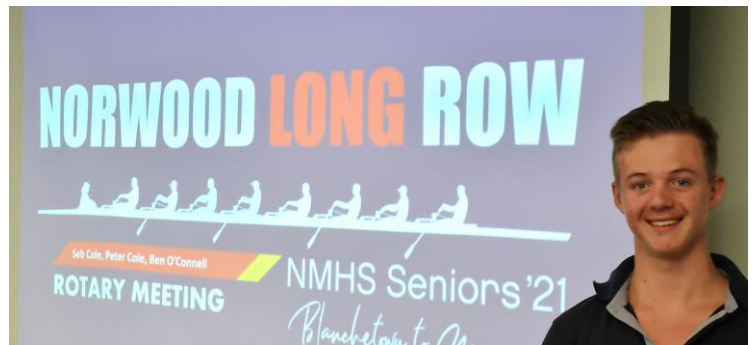
next step. To do that he came up with the idea of "The Long Row" taking the 8 person boat down the Murray from Blanchetown to Mannum.

Initially he thought this would be fairly simple and would raise money for new boats or equipment, but the logistics of holding a 3 day event with accommodation, food and support have proved financially and technically challenging. It has now grown to encompass not only the senior team, but two other school teams as well.

To assist, they have secured a houseboat for the event costing \$2,000. Some other accommodation and facilities have also been secured. However, Seb hopes to raise \$10,000 to cover costs and have enough left over to buy something reasonable for the school – hopefully a new boat.

The 3 day event will be held from 6-8 December this year following their visit to Renmark for a Regatta. It will be done in 3 stages: Blanchetown to Swan Reach 28km, Swan Reach to Walkers Flat 43km, and Walkers Flat to Mannum 55km.

It was a fantastic story of the under dogs snapping at the heels of the big dogs and very inspirational. The ethos of Seb's idea matches closely with ours at Rotary wanting to give back and make it possible for others to pursue their dreams. In that light, the Club Board will consider how we will be supporting this worthy initiative and we will announce that very soon.

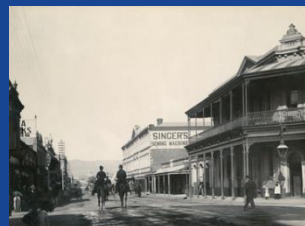

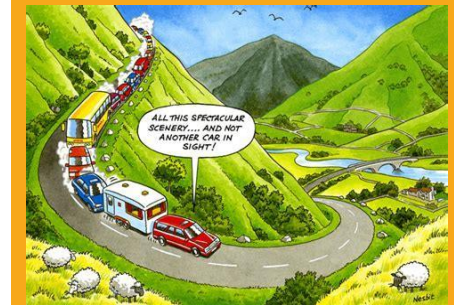
