Guest Speaker: Councillor John Flynn – Woodforde Ward Operation Flinders and Nightingale Reserve

John was elected to Council in 2018 representing the Woodforde Ward, which contains all of Rostrevor and the section of Magill east of St Bernards Rd. Obviously that's where Nightingale Park is, and we have been very pleased that John has shown a great interest in the park and willingness to work with us to improve it.

Unbeknownst to us, John is also involved with Operation Flinders and started off by telling us about a recent visit he did when the camp was on, accompanied by several photos, which was great. John has also been a Rotarian, Lion and was in Apex at one stage, so is very like-minded with our support of such causes and local issues.

Since meeting with some members of the club at Nightingale Park about a year ago, John has taken concerns about the condition of the park back to Council for assessment and action. Initially this resulted in fixing the degraded creek bed and lawns, which have now been corrected.



In September this year Council received a report on the condition of the park with several items scheduled and funded for the 2022/23 budget year. Council endorsed the report and these actions will be going ahead. A copy of that report will be emailed with this report.

The main highlights were the poor condition of paths, tennis court, coaches shelter, signage, interpretive trail and playground, which will all receive attention. Council would, of course, be interested in any contributions to these works and that will be something the club will need to consider soon. The club could also have a role in working with Magill Scouts, Magill Guides and Magill Primary to broker their involvement in some way.

Overall it's fair to say that John's presentation and the work he has done to move this project forward were equally impressive and we were very glad to have him at our meeting to let us know. We look forward to finding practical ways for the club to continue its long involvement with the park through this refurbishment.




