It was great to finally catch up with our local MP, **Vincent Tarzia**, to hear about things going on in the local area. Although an election is looming, I have to say that Vincent remained very apolitical, carefully respecting our Rotary values.

As some know, Vincent & Charissa welcomed baby Leonardo about 4 months ago. Naturally, there have been many sleepless nights, but he certainly rose to the challenge to speak to us early in the morning. We were particularly grateful as this was a busy and sad day with Vincent planning to attend the memorial service for the tragic passing of CFS volunteer, Louise Hincks.

Obviously Vincent is proud of a number of projects he's supported in the local area. In particular, getting some of the traffic light solutions in place at various intersections has been a major advancement. He talked about the importance of partnerships with other tiers of government for a range of local improvements.

However, what I found most interesting was him talking about the challenges of his Police, Emergency Services and Corrections portfolios. Some salient points he raised were about the way Police track offenders nowadays via helicopter surveillance and the Government is greatly increasing the penalties for drug & high speed drivers with a view to extreme discouragement on the first offence.

It was also great to hear that SA has the lowest record of recidivism in Australia, which is the tendency for a person gaoled to reoffend. In SA that rate is around 39% while the national average is around 55%. To that end they are now planning to build a special Rehabilitation Prison to try to bring the figures down further. Sounds awesome and was good to know.

Overall a nice talk from Vincent and we wish him well for the forthcoming election.

Congratulations Rick and Peter




