Joint Meeting with Morialta and PNG Midwifery project

Since I became President, I have harped on about joint meetings with our other local Rotary Clubs. I believe it is important to know who is in these clubs and what they're doing so that we get further ideas and identify possible ways of working together to achieve more. Unfortunately, here we are in my last month of Presidency and here we are just getting to that task. Better late than never!

Morialta are our parent club and it was great to join them at the Tower Hotel for their meeting. It was also an excellent opportunity to catch up on one of their major projects as they had some very important guests and a great presentation to witness.



President Andrew Johnson started off the meeting promptly with the induction of new member Josh. According to some members I was sitting with, Josh and a few other new members have found their club via their web site, which is good intelligence to have. Their web site certainly does have clear "calls to action" as a contrast to ours, so some food for thought and action there.

However, the main event of the evening was a presentation from Professor Helen Hall about the positive impact of the club's PNG Midwifery project. Rotarian Tim Mee introduced the subject by outlining the club's ambitious start to the project, which was a commitment of around \$150,000 over 3 years. Some of this was obtained through RAWCS and other sponsors as well as club fundraising. Quite extraordinary for a club that's barely twice the size of our own!

Rotarian Judi Brown as their International Director then introduced Professor Hall who gave a very concise run down on the problems in PNG. The country has a population of 9 million and around 85% of them are living in remote areas. There are around 250,000 births a year in PNG mostly in these remote regions and only around half have a skilled assistant in attendance. In fact, PNG is estimated to require around 8,000 midwives for this birth rate and has only around 1,000. Consequently, the neonatal death rates are quite extreme.

This is where the Rotary project comes in, which has contributed in a wide range of ways, from provision of basic and essential equipment to training of midwives. She also outlined several cultural impediments that have been difficult to overcome, such as strong religious beliefs and the status of women, but that is also changing.

Overall a fantastic project and at the end of her presentation, Professor Hall was presented a Paul Harris Fellowship by the Morialta Club. Sincere congratulations to our good friends at Morialta for the outstanding work they're doing in this area.

I need to also make a mention of Ian & Suzette Coat, whom I discovered have been regular contributors to the PNG project. Why was I not surprised? Thank you for that selfless support. There were some wise words spoken by Rotarian Bruno Giorgio on the night about passion being a key part of successful projects like the one his club is involved with, and Ian & Suzette certainly are part of that passionate support.

Thanks to those members who joined in and helped keep up neighbourly relations. I think we all learned a lot and new ideas started to be discussed around our table at least, bearing out what I feel is the real value of looking around at what others are doing and seeing how we can work with them to achieve more.

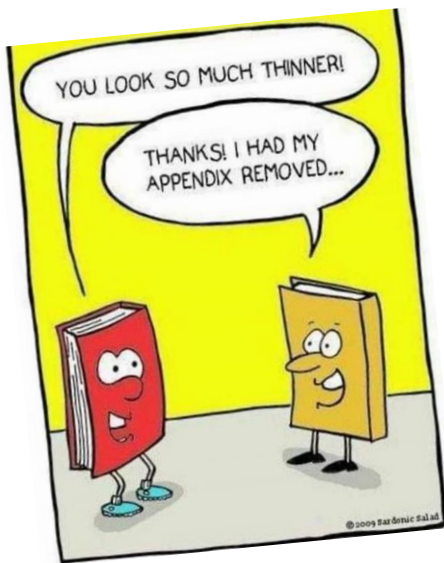
