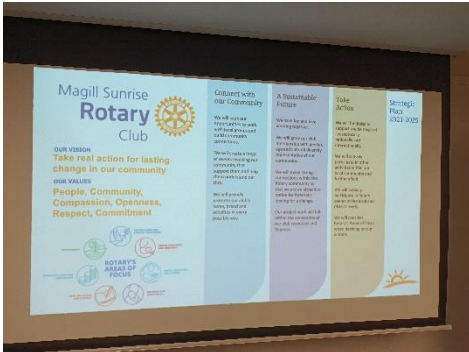

Breakfast with Magill Sunrise Rotary Club

IN keeping with their namesake, the Magill Sunrise Rotary Club welcomed incoming president Lindsay Davis during a breakfast at the Café Outside the Square on Sunday, July 3.

Outgoing president Simon Brewer was farewelled by the club and thanked for his year of service.

The event also congratulated the club's Rotarian of the Year, Colin Hill, and award winners Natasha Schuetze and Ian Coats, who is a three-time recipient of the Paul Harris fellow Sapphire Award.

"Rotarians worldwide are all unpaid volunteers who share their passion for improving our community and generate funds to support worthwhile causes," Mr Davis said.

The Magill Sunrise Rotary Club achieves these values by hosting the Magill Sunrise Market, held on the second Sunday of every month.

The market, which has been running for nearly 14 years, offers visitors both indoor and outdoor stalls selling a wide variety of art

and crafts, clothes, health products and a variety of food items.

"Hot donuts are also a recent addition," Mr Davis said.

"Funds from the market allow our club to send local school kids to Operation Flinders camps, sponsor students on STEM and leadership training programs, provide aid to local, national and international disasters, and finance a wide range of environmental, health and humanitarian projects.

"The market has also been a springboard for the formation of the Campbelltown Repair Cafe. This amazing group repair broken or torn items, so they don't end up in landfill.

"Currently we're also working with Campbelltown Council on significant improvements to Nightingale Park in Magill, which is a fantastic and heavily used local community park."

The Rotary Club also helped to support the community through their handover breakfast, with the breakfast held at Café Outside the Square.

"Cafe Outside the Square provides direct food support and training opportunities to

disadvantaged and vulnerable people across the state, including the homeless," Mr Davis said.

"Community groups like ours and businesses can book and use the café's premises and services – and in doing so, further support our community."

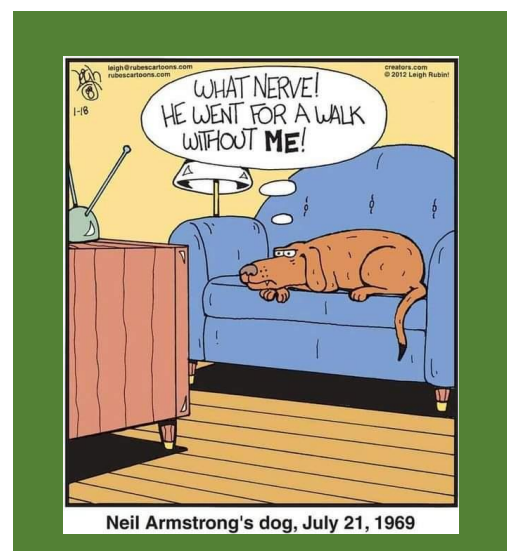
