Guest Speaker: MARCO DI GIROLAMO

Marco began his laboratory career back in 1978, working in a small private laboratory. In 1988 he started work at the Queen Victoria Hospital, which then merged with the Adelaide Children's Hospital to form what would become the Adelaide Women's and Children's Hospital (WCH), where he worked until retirement in 2019.

His particular fields of interest are neonatal, paediatric and obstetric haematology. He has given talks at state, national and international medical laboratory science seminars.

Marco has recently been awarded a certificate of Merit from the Australian Institute of Medical Scientists for his service to the profession.

In his spare time, Marco attends high school career evenings, promoting medical science as a career, and in January 2020 (just pre-COVID) he volunteered on a medic ship in PNG, diagnosing TB in sputum samples (slide and PCR techniques), and is heading back in November.

He also volunteers at South Pacific School Aid, an organization which collects de-commissioned books from schools in SA and organizes to send them (on large pallets) to disadvantaged schools on South Pacific Islands, PNG and Africa, where they use them to set up libraries and school curricula.

HOW DO WE CELEBRATE?




Our 1,200th Meeting is scheduled to fall on Tuesday 15th November this year.


