December Market Beneficiary

Our cancelled November market was to raise funds for victims of the devastating Victorian floods in October. Then in mid-November NSW was hit in a similar way with unprecedented water levels.

Despite the loss of the November market, last week the Board of Magill Sunrise Rotary met and decided to donate \$1,000 immediately to Victorian flood victims and then after our Mega Christmas Market will donate a further \$1000 to NSW flood victims.

These donations will happen via RAWCS - Rotary Australia World Community Service who work with Rotarians in the affected areas to maximise the direct benefits to the disaster victims.

OFFICIAL OPENING OF MAGILL VILLAGE

Saturday 3 December 2022

The Magill Village Partnership, a collaboration between the City of Burnside and Campbelltown City Council to create an exemplar 'Village' model that encompasses urban renewal streetscape improvements and urban landscape work came to fruition on Saturday with the opening of Magill Village precinct.

The two councils have worked together to completely revitalise the Magill Village precinct and make the area a more attractive place to shop, stay and visit. This project was funded by the Australian Government with \$2 million from the Federal 'Community Development Grant Program' and \$5.75 million from the State 'Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program'.

- I was the guest speaker at the 2022 Children's Writing Completion presentation ceremony, organised by the Prospect Council, where I was delighted to be among other young people who shared the same passion for writing with me
- I was awarded the 2022 Walkerville Council Young Volunteer award
- I was awarded the 2022 Children's Week Award (thank you Rotarian Les Dennis for the kind nomination)

At a personal level, I feel that this experience has helped me to build up my confidence, public speaking skills, resilience, to believe in myself and my abilities and to learn that my voice matters.

I am now looking forward having some rest during the upcoming school holidays to recharge my batteries and I am really looking forward for what the new year entails (especially going to Year 9).
