Also, we heard from **Molly Sweeney** who recently received our club's 'Service Above Self' award at the Norwood International High graduation ceremony.

RYPEN (Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment)

RYPEN is a three-day residential program of enrichment for young people aged 14 to 17 – and provides opportunities for young people to develop important life-skills and leadership skills. Attendees are fully sponsored by Rotary.

Alice was a member of Silver Team, which meant covering one of the team in silver foil and taking on the role of a robot.

Harrison, a member of Red Team, also had his brother in attendance as a mentor of another group. The Red team possessed superpowers and acted accordingly.

Both indicated in their application they wanted to challenge themselves; and learn new skills. After the presentations, it was clear that both are highly ambitious students who thought **RYPEN** was one of the best experiences they had participated in.

GLOBAL POLIO ERADICATION UPDATE

Since 1988, when Rotary launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, the world has moved even closer to eradicating this disease.

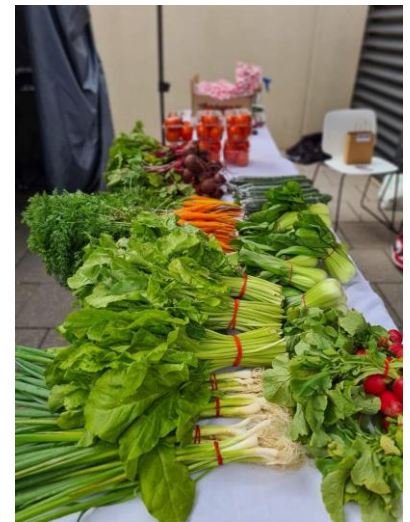
For much of the developed world, polio is a distant memory. Long gone are the days when children went to bed with what their parent's thought was a mild flu, only to wake up rubber-limbed and burning with fever.

Rotary Clubs around the world continue to raise awareness, vaccinate children in vulnerable countries, and fund more vaccines and research.

In 1988, poliovirus paralysed an estimated 100 children a day. Since then, cases have plummeted an estimated 99.9% with less than 20 cases confirmed world-wide in 2022.

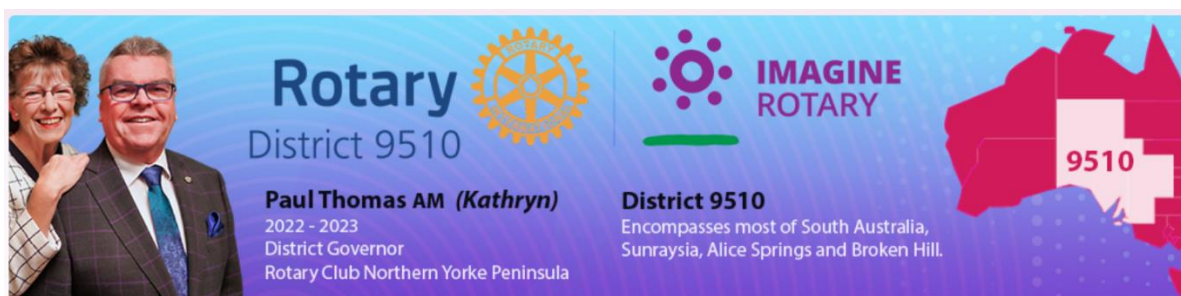
