Guest Speaker: DUNCAN REDMAN

'Succeeding in the Game of Life' was the theme of our guest speaker, Duncan Redman, at our breakfast meeting. Duncan and Club President Lindsay go way back to both studying for their accounting degrees. Lindsay dedicated his working life to red, green and black ink in Adelaide, while Duncan went on to tackle the world, working in London, Hong Kong, Sydney, just to mention a few.

Duncan is also a board member of Propel SA. Duncan made a career change and set up his motivational business, Dare to Dream, passing on what he had learned to those who were

prepared to listen. Duncan gave us a cut down version of his formula for success.

Duncan spoke about **Choices**, which are often dictated by habit. Choice #1 is to be **Judgemental** and shift the blame from ourselves to others. This leads to fear and therefore **no change**. In the Game of Life, it's playing not to lose. We also have the choice of **Acknowledgement**, which leads to responsibility and on to love. It's playing to win. Although diametrically opposed these 2 choices coexist in each of us and compete for dominance. Our default is Judgemental mode. We are **wired to detect threats**; it takes 0.70 seconds to detect a potential threat. At this time we make choices between **Flight**, **Fight**, **Freeze** or **Appease**.

Duncan emphasised the importance of **Language**; what I say today will become my reality. Judgement mode leads to third party language while Acknowledgement mode leads to first party language. The risk of fist party language (what I believe) is that not everyone will accept my beliefs. Duncan finished with the Wolves within story which he recently came across in Ash Barty's bio, and recommends.



There are two wolves within all of us, one good and altruistic, the other mean and self-centred. You will have to read Ash's book to find out more.

Sub-Editor's note: Carl Jung had something to say on this topic also, but he reckons the wolves story is better. Thanks Duncan for making us think.






QUIZ QUESTION:

In 1791 where did the HMS Pandora run aground and sink?

Answer: Great Barrier Reef



The 24-gun frigate ran aground at the edge of the reef, eventually sinking in 30 metres of water. One mutineer and 35 crew lost their lives, and the survivors made a phenomenal journey in long boats to Indonesia (then Java). Discovered on the 15th November 1977, the HMS Pandora is one of the best preserved shipwrecks in Australia.
