What an amazing couple of months we've had to kick off 2023!!!

If you ever wondered how our club contributes to building communities locally and around the world – just look at last month's achievements and what is taking shape for the near future.

Some of the highlights were:

- The "Lift The Lid Walk" was a huge success and raised \$7,905.11 that will go immediately into mental health research programs.
- Our club is donating \$1,000 to ShelterBox to support their work in countries impacted by war and natural disasters.



- We are part of the Environment Forum looking at what Rotary is doing on a global stage; and projects undertaken by local clubs.
- A **Peace Pole** is being provided to Stradbroke Primary to help spread the message of peace around the world.
- We assisted our friends at Campbelltown Rotary Club with carpark marshalling at their "Classics on the Park" day.

- Planning is underway for our Club's involvement in the upcoming Magill Village Launch event.

## Guest Speaker: DAVID WEST



Our guest speaker this morning, David West, is a consultant to Burnside and Campbelltown Councils regarding the Magill Precinct. His mini bio below gives a clue as to why David was right up there as one of our club's most entertaining speakers.

**David West – Premier Retail Marketing - Director** David West is a retail consultant with over 30 years of experience managing and marketing mainstreets and shopping centres, including Westfield Marion and Rundle Mall in Adelaide. David has travelled across the UK, USA and NZ including 12 months working in London highstreets.

David developed the **2015-2020 Experience Adelaide City Retail Strategy** and Retail Strategies for Christchurch City Centre, Jetty Road Glenelg, Fed Square Melbourne, Queanbeyan NSW, Fremantle, Mandurah and Albany in WA.

David provides practical retail and business advice to Councils, towns and City centres across Australia and New Zealand to develop a sustainable mix of businesses through proactive leasing and management strategies.

He is passionate about well-managed streets, and he has written a retail strategy book called 'Mainstreet Management: Successful Retail Strategies'.

In December 2020, he launched a new Retail Adelaide City website <u>www.retailadelaidecity.com.au</u> to develop the business mix in the Adelaide CBD main streets.

The origins of David's presentation "Picking up Papers in Main Streets", came from his habit of picking up rubbish in open air shopping areas as opposed to pristine shopping centres. David was once spotted by a corporate dibber-dobber picking up rubbish and was reported to HR for his ad hoc rubbish activities; the offence was described as a health hazard. David went on to explain the different approaches to marketing in shopping centres and street premises in the CBB and suburbs.

Most of us like the experience of a coffee on a boulevard and shopping centres try to replicate that experience in their centre. One interesting trick that David revealed was retailers in shopping centres lay carpet on the floor in the women's fashion department. The silence created by the carpet slows pedestrian traffic, thus increasing the chance of random purchases.

Covid has changed our shopping habits forever, with growth in online food/consumables being the future.

In the short time available, David was able to cover Main Street v City Centre and the four components of Management, Marketing, Business Mix and Streetscape. Well done, David.

**ALL** money received from the purchase of a sausage, bacon and egg sandwich or zucchini fritter at our monthly market goes to a good cause. At the present time the world seems to be swamped with disasters; earthquakes, war, flooding, cyclones and fires. To lend a hand the Rotary Club of Magill Sunrise, with your support, has donated a

**shelterbox**, to assist those in desperate and urgent need. Rotary's sturdy green **ShelterBoxes** are designed to help people who have lost everything. They are filled with practical tools and utensils that help to create the framework for everyday life. Each contains a family-sized tent that protects people from the elements and provides a safe space in which people can start to recover from physical and emotional trauma. A tent may not be the Ritz, but when one is

standing in freezing rain, in sub zero temperatures with only the clothes they stand up in, it means the difference between life and death.

The contents differ depending on the disaster and the climate, but items such as solar lights, water storage and purification equipment, thermal blankets and cooking utensils help start the process of creating a home.

## **ENVIROMENT FORUM -11 MARCH 2023**

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL FORUM - 2 pm, Saturday 11 March 2023, Charles Campbell College.**



For many years Clubs in our District have supported their communities by undertaking environmental projects, well before Rotary added the Environment as a seventh Area of Focus. Our Forum planned for 11 March will have many facets and will be of interest to all Rotarians.

What we have scheduled is: -

- Keynote address by Past RI President Ian Riseley (and current International Chair of the Rotary Foundation). A long-term advocate for the environment, who challenged us in 2017/18 to plant 1.2 million trees, and easily surpassed his target. Ian will inform us what is happening around the Rotary world of an environmental nature, and even more importantly how we can use Foundation funding towards our environmental projects. Ian is an engaging speaker, and undoubtedly the best qualified person to share these messages.
- A Calperum update. For over two decades Clubs in our District have been involved with Calperum Station (just out of Renmark) in many different ways. In the last couple of months the River Murray waters have reached higher than any of us have ever seen, but fortunately the damage was less than we anticipated. Julie Robertson, Operations Manager at Calperum, will provide us with an update on the floods, tasks that need to be done soon, plus their strategic plans for the future.
- Soap Box spots. Five short presentations will highlight the breadth of environmental projects happening in the District, and how your club could become more involved. You will learn how to engage with schools, local councils, and even influence a state government to enact legislation.

Obviously, there will be some time to answer questions during the formal part of the Forum, or over refreshments to follow.


