Guest Speaker: **BRUCE DOLMAN**

You may recall that John Flynn and Bruce Dolman were inducted into the club on the same evening at the Maylands Hotel. John has already given his 'Behind the Badge' address so now it was Bruce's turn.

Having known a little of Bruce's background I introduced Bruce as 'Mr Been There, Done That'. Bruce was born in January 1951 and grew up on Government Road (now South Road) Croydon. As it turns out not far from Robyn Holcroft's old stamping ground. The family eventually moved to Flinders Park, where Bruce attended Flinders Park Primary and eventually Thebarton Boys Tech. Bruce left school at the end of year 10 to start an electrician's apprenticeship. Bruce excelled at Trade School and his apprenticeship and went on to do advanced courses.

After 7 years, life changed course and Bruce started a 20 year association with Wormald International. Wormald was eventually taken over by Tyco, which soon led to redundancies. In his managerial role Bruce has to pass on the sad news to his uncle who had been with the firm for more than 40 years. Any guilt Bruce had soon evaporated when he too got the chop.

Bruce was not out of the corporate world for too long and worked on the redeveloped Myer Centre. Eventually, as Bruce put it, he suffered a midlife crisis and purchased a deli at the corner of Gorge and Russell Roads, Athelstone. After 3 years Bruce sold, which as it turned out was the right time, when deregulation saw 24-hour petrol outlets/servos taking much of the deli's trade. Bruce re-joined the corporate world again and obtained 50% equity in a new start up and built it to the point that it became an attractive business for takeover. Bruce sold his 50% in 2017 and is now retired from full time work.

Outside of work, Bruce is married to Vas, a successful educator, who in addition to a diploma of education, has degrees in Special Schools and Teaching Hearing Impaired (Vas may be overqualified for making donuts as the Magill Market).
