## Green Corner – The Gums Landcare Group

**This month's article is provided by invitation. We asked Gerry Butler as Chair of The Gums Landcare Group (TGLG) to write a precise of what the group is doing....**

The Gums Landcare Group (TGLG) was formed in early 2016 by Gerry Butler who sought other local residents to assist in providing some 'TLC' for The Gums Recreational Reserve, especially the northern side through which Third Creek flows. Over the last 7 years the group, which now has 45 members and 6 Patrons, has planted many thousands of native plants and established 4 Native Bee 'n' Bee Hotels in the park.

Of particular interest to the group is the care and maintenance of The Gums and an understanding of the ecological processes in The Gums and the opportunity for environmental education of the wider community, especially schoolchildren. The St Joseph's Tranmere primary school is a long-term member and the staff and students regularly participate in activities in The Gums, with the TGLG and as a recreational learning outing.

The landcare group has several projects underway, including olive control along Third Creek, Rehabilitation of the bed and banks of Third Creek in The Gums and the Community Landcare Nursery.

The Campbelltown City Council and the Rotary Clubs of Campbelltown are supporting the landcare group to establish a shed as part of the nursery, in association with the Newton Community Garden and Rotary Magill Sunrise contributed \$1000 towards this project following the March Market.

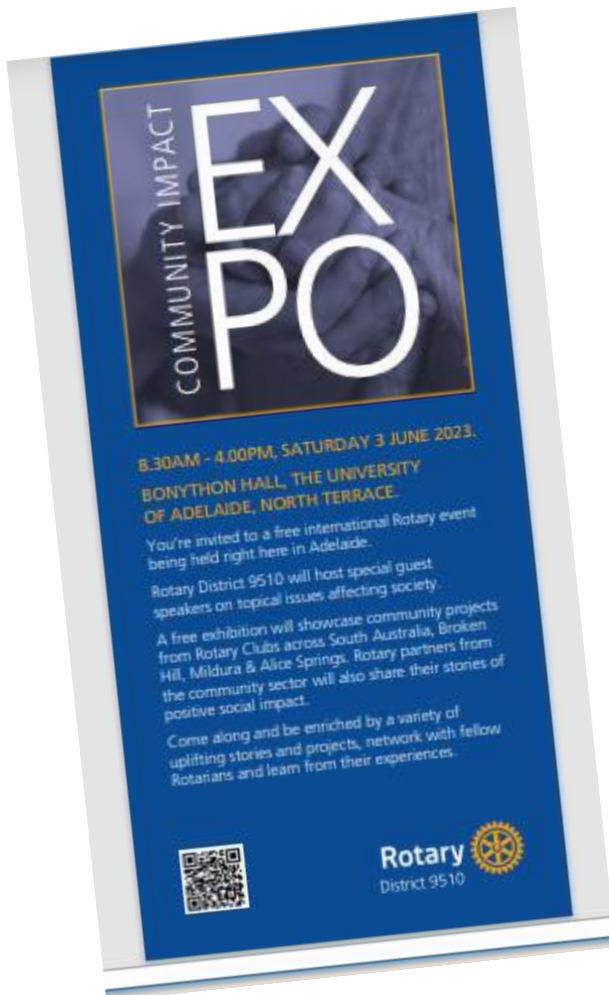

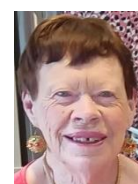

Magill Sunrise and Campbelltown Rotary Clubs have locked in **Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> October 2023** as the date for **the 2<sup>nd</sup> 'Lift The Lid Walk for mental health' in Campbelltown.**

The walk will again start and finish from Campbelltown Memorial Oval, adjacent to the Magill Sunrise Market – and the date neatly falls within Mental Health month.

Again, the Lift The Lid Walk will have two aims:

1. to raise awareness of the incidence of mental illness in Australian communities; and
2. to raise funds for mental health research being conducted by Australian Rotary Health

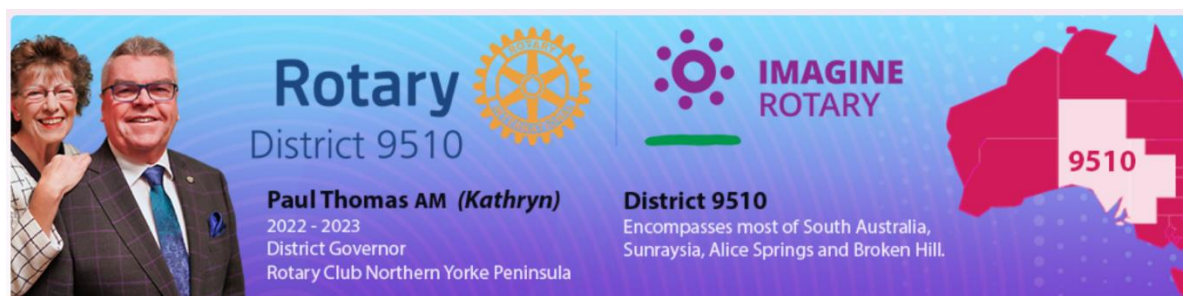
