### Guest Speaker: DARRYL CATLIN



President Lindsay summed up our guest speaker with these words, 'Vines, Wines and Passion'. I guess when describing Darryl Catlin I could stop there, but there's more.

Darryl is the Principal of Catlin Wines of Magill <https://catlinwines.com.au>. His passion for wine making started as a lad when his father gave him two acres of grapes at Gomersal to tend and prune for pocket money.

Darryl said that no one goes into viticulture for the money. You study hard for a degree and then work as a cellar hand looking for advancement. He had two years at university studying pharmacy, but all things grapes (including bottle, caps and corks) kept luring him back.

His business degree was not wasted as he advanced through the industry. He learned about Aussie and global wines in the heady days of wine making at the Royal Oak Hotel, witnessing the introduction of the screw cap. He was a shaker and mover with Shaw and Smith, which was eventually sold to Dan Murphy's.

Darryl told us you need around \$2m to set up a basic winery. Many brands are processed by a few wineries. A bottling line will leave no change from \$3m.

In 2013 he started Catlin, but still worked for Sidewood which he helped as a start-up.

By 2021 Catlin had its own cellar door at Magill Road, Magill, which is the suburb in which the Catlin family lives. Catlin Wines is open Friday arvo till late and open again on Sunday afternoon.

Catlin Wines promotes local foods and produce. Darryl and family like to give back to the community in which they live. Catlin Wines has also been a generous donor to our club when it comes to raffle prizes etc.

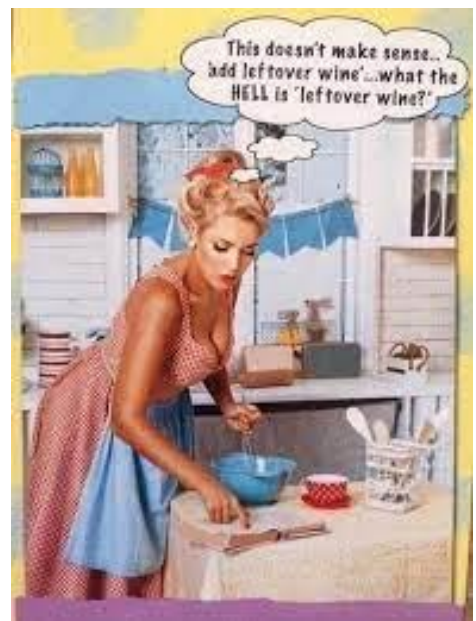
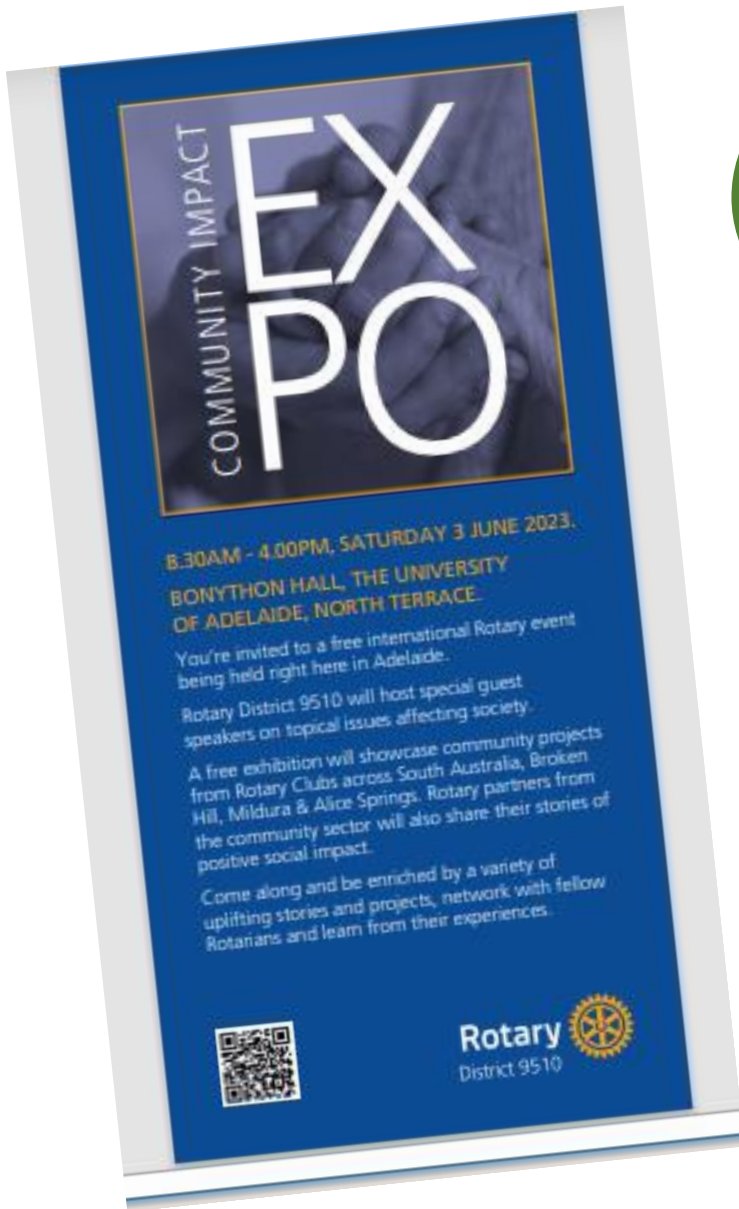

## LIFT THE LID WALK



Magill Sunrise and Campbelltown Rotary Clubs have locked in **Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> October 2023** as the date for **the 2<sup>nd</sup> 'Lift The Lid Walk for mental health' in Campbelltown.**

The walk will again start and finish from Campbelltown Memorial Oval, adjacent to the Magill Sunrise Market – and the date neatly falls within Mental Health month.

Again, the Lift The Lid Walk will have two aims:

1. to raise awareness of the incidence of mental illness in Australian communities; and
2. to raise funds for mental health research being conducted by Australian Rotary Health

The inaugural event was highly successful on both fronts – with lots of positive comments from participants, and **the net surplus of \$7,885.00 forwarded to Australian Rotary Health.**

For the record, Magill Sunrise Rotary is credited with \$2,991.75 as a donation to Australian Rotary Health for mental health research.
