Guest Speaker: **ADRIAN FERRARETTO** "Renewable Power, Storage & Electric Vehicles"



Adrian Ferraretto has a 20+ year career in the renewable energy industry. He owned, operated and then sold Solar Shop Australia and shortly after founded Tindo Solar - Australia's only solar panel manufacturer. Adrian sold Tindo in 2017 and now owns and operates a digital marketing company specialising in solar power lead generation in Australia, Sweden, Norway and Spain. Since purchasing his first electric vehicle in 2006, Adrian has developed a keen interest in electric vehicles and is now known as an electric vehicle enthusiast and a Tesla fan boy.

Rotary Clubs and our District are now able to provide humanitarian aid in partnership with the 'New Dawn' organisation in Ukraine.

As a breakfast club, Magill Sunrise knows plenty about new dawns. So, we look forward to contributing to the direct assistance being provided to Odesa and the southern villages of Ukraine over the coming months, even years. Stay tuned (or even better, get onboard with us).

Guest Speaker: TIM MEE – “NEW DAWN”



Tim Mee B.Bus, long serving member of Morialta Club spoke to us about 'New Dawn', a Rotary Project to assist the people of Ukraine.

Tim, not to be confused with Mr Smee, Captain Hook's buddy, migrated from the UK to work in Shipping in Tasmania and later moved to SA to work in the same field. Proximity to the sea has turned him into a Power supporter. Tim, switched from shipping to Business SA and eventually became self-employed consultant and retired as an officer of Independent Association of Business. Tim's title with our district is 'International Service Chair - District 9510.

'New Dawn' Ukrainian Crisis was recently registered with RAWCS (Account 58-2022-23) providing tax deductibility on any contributions. RAWCS also provides a better exchange rate for money sent to Ukraine.

Direct Aid to Rotary Friends on the ground in the Odesa region makes sure that there is no dilution of aid sent for the purposes of heating, cooking, power (generators) and food essentials. Friends on the ground are Maurice (link to Adelaide Club) and Julia, a local of Odessa.

Delivering essentials to civilians is not without its dangers. We were shocked to hear that if the Russians are aware of a regular gathering place (be it a school or hospital) then they will bombard it. Julia and Maurice deliver their goods and move on quickly for the protection of themselves and the residents, who as it turns out are mainly women.

The men have left to assist with the military and the children have been moved away for their protection from random bombardment. There are 80 or so 'forgotten villages' of Odesa. Rotary International has approved a grant of \$25,000 via the Ukraine Disaster Response Grant.

One of the biggest problems in Odesa is electrical power. Tim tells us that a good generator costs in excess of \$2,000. Tim says that irrespective of peace, Ukraine will need assistance for years to come. I'm sure that profit from one of our Magill Markets will be dedicated to 'New Dawn' and maybe the purchase of generator.
