REVIEW OF THE ROTARY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION: MELBOURNE



A reoccurring theme was the importance of eradicating Polio, where it only exists in 2 neighbouring countries in very few numbers. It may sound like an easy task, but front-line workers face the real possibility of being killed in pursuit of their humanitarian work.

The other theme was encouraging women to take a leading role, not just in Rotary, but the world. World President, Jennifer Jones was super impressive. Why she hasn't been offered a job at the UN is beyond the author.

Getting to and from accommodation to the Rod Laver Arena and the House of Friendship and Breakout Sessions at the Riverbank Exhibition Centre was not easy and as my old dad would say, taking 'Shanks Pony' was the best option; that's OK is fit, but the demographic of Rotary means many struggle on foot.

Overall, an impressive list of speakers, with plenty to see and do at the Hours of Friendship and Breakout Sessions. Not easy to get around, but free trams and trains in spare time made sight-seeing a breeze.

Currently £2,788 (over AUD\$4,000) has been raised. GREAT EFFORT.


ROTARY CENTENARY PROJECT

The Childhood Cancer Association provides practical, hands-on support for children with cancer and their families. The Association has evolved over time to offer a range of professional support services led by a small team of psychologists. When a child has cancer, it affects the whole family. Rotary's aim is to assist with the funding of Hospital Support Bags which includes practical, essential items for the whole family – and Elliot the dog to be a friend for the child throughout their journey.

The PETER NELSON LEUKAEMIA RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP FUND



Cancer Council SA—since 1978.

Established by Marjorie Jackson-Nelson – the Lithgow Flash and former Governor of South Australia – in memory of her husband, Australian Olympic cyclist, Peter Nelson who passed away from leukaemia. The fund supports research into leukaemia with the goal of finding a cure for cancer. Promising progress is being made, with leukaemia survival rates increasing by as much as 20% in the past 20 years. Research currently being funded at SAHMRI is investigating alternative targeted treatment options for Tcell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (T-ALL).
