### **OUR GUEST SPEAKER - PETER MAYER**



#### "How My Family Escaped the Nazis"

Having travelled with Peter Mayer (Morialta Club) in 2019, Mark Thompson heard a great escape story from WWII. It that was amongst the best, so Mark asked Peter to repeat the hair raising experiences of his parents.

Having served in the German Army and participated in the invasions of Poland and France, **Klaus Mayer** was being recalled to Germany to face an uncertain future because of his Jewish ancestry. With the help of his CO he went AWOL and hid out with a friends posing as a gardener, unfit for military service until the weather permitted an escape over the Alps from Austria to Switzerland. During this time, luck was with Klaus on a number of occasions. Getting lost on a moonless night saw Klaus end up back where he had started, so he had to cool his heels for a few more day.

However, with the aid on an altimeter and compass and being a skilled mountaineer, he took the high routes rather than the valleys and made it to Switzerland. It wasn't all cuckoo clocks and Swiss cheese once across the border, because, if caught he would be immediately deported. As it was, Klaus was imprisoned in Zurich in solitary confinement for 3 months until his refugee status could be established.

It was while in Zurich that Klaus met Peter's mother, who had earlier escaped the clutches of the Nazis for her activities in spreading anti Nazi literature. After the war, Peter was born in Hamburg, but looking for a fresh start his parents came to South Australia. Klaus eventually set up business in Mary Street, Unley.

Thanks Peter for presenting this ripping yarn about your dad.

## KIRSTY STARK'S AWARD



#### The CHILDHOOD CANCER ASSOCIATION



The Childhood Cancer Association provides practical, hands-on support for children with cancer and their families. The Association has evolved over time to offer a range of professional support services led by a small team of psychologists. When a child has cancer, it affects the whole family. Rotary's aim is to assist with the funding of Hospital Support Bags which includes practical, essential items for the whole family – and Elliot the dog to be a friend for the child throughout their journey.

#### The PETER NELSON LEUKAEMIA RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP FUND



Established by Marjorie Jackson-Nelson – the Lithgow Flash and former Governor of South Australia – in memory of her husband, Australian Olympic cyclist, Peter Nelson who passed away from leukaemia. The fund supports research into leukaemia with the goal of finding a cure for cancer. Promising progress is being made, with leukaemia survival rates increasing by as much as 20% in the past 20 years. Research currently being funded at SAHMRI is investigating alternative targeted treatment options for Tcell acute lymphoblastic leukaemia (T-ALL).


