Promote peace

By keeping our focus on building peace in the world and within ourselves, Rotary helps create a more peaceful world and a future worth living.

Continue the work of past leaders

He pledged to maintain the Empowering Girls initiative and uphold the emphasis on diversity, equity, and inclusion throughout Rotary. He also noted recent events that underscore the importance of Rotary's continuing focus on polio eradication.



Focus on mental health

McInally believes Rotary members should offer hope to those affected by mental health challenges, saying "Reaching out for help is courageous — and continuing on a path toward wellness is even more so." He added that Rotary will work to improve mental health services in the next year and beyond. Rotary should be known as an organization that takes care of its members as well as the people it serves. "Any mental health professional will tell you that by helping others, we essentially help ourselves."

It's been an absolute pleasure to be President of the Rotary Club of Magill Sunrise during the 2022/2023 year — and I certainly look forward to being part of more **Fellowship**, **Fun and Service in 2023/2024**.




OUR GUEST SPEAKER was OUR MEMBERS & VISITORS


