## GUEST SPEAKER: ANDREW DEGARIS



The virus Polio, or poliomyelitis, is a paralysing and potentially deadly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. The virus spreads from person to person, typically through contaminated water. It can then attack the nervous system.

Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever, and this morning PP Andrew DeGaris from the Rotary Club of West Lakes and District Chair for End Polio Now brought us up to speed on the **"End Polio Now"** program.

Many of us thought that Rotary International was the primary driver of End Polio Now, but although a significant contributor it is still a junior partner. The annual cost is around a billion dollars. Rotary's target is \$50M, which the Gates Foundation will match on a two for one basis.

Andrew pointed out that most of Rotary Australia's contribution comes in one big hit towards the end of our financial year, which isn't very helpful for planning and that a regular drip feed would be a helpful way to go.

The mantra for Rotary for the past few years has been 'We are this Close' when it comes to the eradication of polio and that polio cases has been reduced to single digits, but this only applies to the Wild Virus. We don't hear much about the Vaccine Derived Virus, which has actually been created from the oral vaccine program.

The oral vaccine program requires three doses for it to offer full immunity, but where this has not occurred in areas of poor hygiene a vaccine derived virus has evolved, which has spread in significant numbers. By way of example Orthodox Jews in Israel are opposed to vaccination. This has led to the vaccine derived virus being brought into New York and being detected in Jewish communities there.

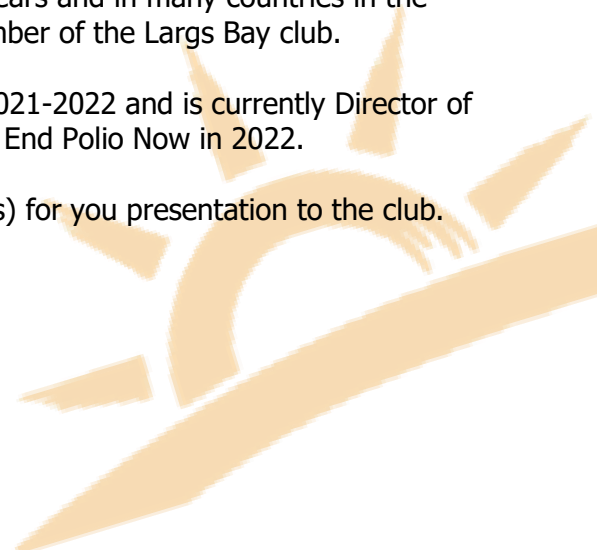
There are many hot spots in Africa. Reverting to needle delivery of the old vaccine is one way to tackle the new variant, but thankfully a new oral vaccine, NoPv2, has been devoted to counter the variant.

Andrew has worked in the oil and gas industry for many years and in many countries in the Pacific region. A Rotoractor in the 80s, he has been a member of the Largs Bay club.

He joined West Lakes in 2017 and was club president in 2021-2022 and is currently Director of International/Foundation. He became the district Chair for End Polio Now in 2022.

### Answers:

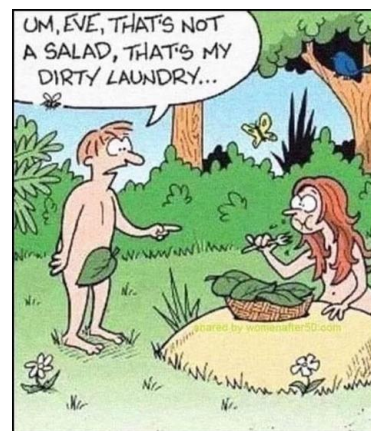


## DISTRICT CONFERENCE – LOXTON – 15-17MARCH 2024

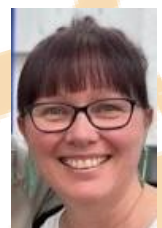
