GUEST SPEAKERS: MICHAEL & YVONNE LACEY OAM

Michael and Yvonne Lacey spoke to us today about their experiences when they inadvertently rented a meth smoke house during the Covid lockdowns. It wasn't too long before Yvonne started to experience symptoms of illness, followed by Michael. As it turned out the former tenants were heavy meth users and their drug of choice had seeped into the lackeys' clothing, furniture, rugs etc. all of which had to be destroyed.

Meth can even seep into gyprock. They estimated that their losses in the thousands and with no compensation coming from the landlord. Defusing of meth can continue for years. Some homes



need to be bulldozed. The unsuspecting residents of a meth house such as an infant can be exposed to the meth 24/7. Children are the worst effected resulting in damage to teeth and brain, headaches and tremors and symptoms mimicking ADHD.

For every contaminated meth house discovered there are another 20 that are not discovered. Contamination can come from Labs, smoke houses and trafficking. One trafficking house can contaminate another 500 of meth users. Neighbour's homes can also be contaminated.

How do you pick a potential meth user/trafficker. Well, you can't. They can be well educated, well dressed, and well spoken. They can have false IDs and references. Unscrupulous landlords and real estate agents don't help. There is no obligation on landlords to prove that a house for rent is not contaminated.

What are the authorities doing? In short, nothing. WA is the only State that is attempting to tackle this menace. There was an article in the Advertiser in March 2021, featuring the Lacey's story including positive comments the then shadow Legal Affairs, Kyam Maher and the then Housing Minister, Michelle Lensik, but nothing has eventuated.

Yes, professional compulsory testing will add to the cost of renting. At a time of rental shortage, it's probably expedient to turn a blind eye, rather than come down hard, but the Lacey's say what about the long-term brain damaged done to children.

Meth is now the new asbestos.

What can the public do? Lobby parliamentarians, warn others. Before renting a house, check with the neighbours who will know what's up. Make sure your rental contract covers meth as well as your contents insurance. There are DYI tests that cost \$400 but can also be misleading if not done properly because one part of a room can be contaminated, while another is not.

Bedrooms, toilets, and bathrooms are more likely to be meth contaminated.

Thanks once again Michael and Yvonne, keep up the rage.
