GUEST SPEAKER: CR. LUCI BLACKBOROUGH



Our guest speaker last Tuesday morning was Councillor Luci Blackborough (Hectorville Ward). Luci was only aged 18 when first elected and she is now into her second term.

Luci told us she became interested in Local Government when as a 16–17-year-old she spent one day per week at the City of Unley as part of her school studies. She said that she had excellent mentors on how Councils operate, which meant by age 18 she thought she was able to transition from a member of YAC (Youth Advisory Council) to offer her services as a Councillor to the good citizens of the City of Campbelltown.

Luci gave us update on things happening in her ward and the City of Campbelltown and reminded us to look at a news update included with our Council Rates.

City of Campbelltown is also interested in feedback on published issue and any others that come to mind.

In Hectorville Ward, Luci brought us up to speed on surveys on traffic conditions in Ross Road and Gladstone Avenue. Two hundred thousand dollars has also been allocated to make Shakespeare Avenue user friendly for pedestrians.

Mounds have been created on the eastern side of Daly Oval for dirt bikers as well as an upgrade in process at the skateboard park near the Paradise bus interchange.

There was more, but being quick as well as eloquent this reporter was unable to keep up.
